1. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 9:30 am by Randy Bruer, Chairman.

- 5. Grant Opportunities and Reports:
 - <u>System of Care:</u> Next week, Tabitha Amundson, DHS lead for the grant, will be here for a site visit and to lay out expectations. Family Partner positions have been posted in the Ada and Win-E-Mac area and will close the end of January. There remain a few questions to be answered regarding the budget, e.g., if we are allowed to use the funds not expended at the beginning of the grant period, then we can offer a better benefits package to the Family Partners. Tri-Valley Opportunity Council is preparing materials for orientation and training.
 - Grant Opportunities: Very dry at the moment. Volunteer Pre-K will be coming out online.
- 6. School Safety: Governor Tim Walz wants to increase monies available for school safety. Bruer and a law enforcement person have been asked to speak on rural school safety at breakout sessions for the Minnesota Governor's Conference in February. Larger schools have law enforcement persons on site, but rural schools don't always have that option. In fact, in smaller communities it can take between 25-45 minutes for first responders to arrive. We need to revisit our school emergency preparedness/crisis plans. Discussion then ensued on the merits of School Resource Officers (SRO). The benefits are that they have a feel for school layout, and have community knowledge which they can bring to their work with students. Bruer wants to include the NW MN Council of Collaboratives in his talk; Auchenpaugh will deliver our brochures to him.
