Advent Family Devotional 2023



THIS DEVOTIONAL GUIDE HAS BEEN DESIGNED WITH FAMILIES IN MIND -
A SIMPLE, EASY-TO-MEMORIZE CALL AND RESPONSE REPEATED EACH DAY,
SHORT DAILY SCRIPTURE VERSES, AND WEEKLY THEMES WITH A SHORT
EXPLANATION FOR KIDS AND LONGER EXPLANATION FOR PARENTS. THE
GUIDE IS DESIGNED TO GO ALONG WITH THE LIGHTING OF AN ADVENT
WREATH. WE SUGGEST CREATING A DAILY FAMILY RHYTHM FOR THE ADVENT
SEASON - A FEW MINUTES AT THE BEGINNING OF DINNERTIME OR BEFORE
BED, FOR EXAMPLE - TO LIGHT THE WREATH AND USE THIS GUIDE.



THE SYMBOLISM of THE ADVENT WREATH

LIGHT / "The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world" (John 1:9). As Christ's Advent, or "coming," draws nearer, another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more.

CIRCLE / The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us—a love that sent his Son into the world to redeem us from sin and renew all things.

EVERGREENS / The evergreen trimmings represent eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.

PURPLE / Violet is a traditional liturgical color used to signify a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. Advent is the season where we wait in our "darkness" with hopeful expectation for our promised redemption - just as the whole world did before Christ's birth, and just as the whole world does now as we eagerly await his promised return.

PINK / The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day is almost over. Rose is a traditional liturgical color used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle on the third Sunday of Advent.



This week we celebrate the hope that is ours because God came near to us in Jesus, and because Jesus is coming back to fix everything.

During Advent we remember Israel's waiting and longing for Jesus the Messiah, their (and our) only hope for liberation from sin and restored relationship with God. And we remember that we are still waiting. When we look at the world around us that is still broken and subject to sin and death, we hold fast to our Hope that Jesus is alive, that he is at work today establishing his kingdom on earth, and that one day he will return to make all things new.

Parent: Lord, you are the light of the world.

Children: O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

WEEK 2 / PEACE

This week we celebrate the peace that Jesus came to bring - peace with God, and peace in our hearts amidst the storms of life.

During Advent we celebrate God's nearness as we cry out for Emmanuel, "God with us." And we reflect on the many ways that Jesus brings us peace - the peace he purchased for us on the cross, the peace of his presence and nearness amidst every trial, sorrow, and concern of this life, and the peace that comes from our confident expectation that he is returning and will one day wipe away every tear and restore everything that is broken.

Parent: Lord, you are the light of the world.

Children: O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

WEEK 3 / JOY

This week we celebrate the joy that Christ's Advent is near. We will not have to wait forever.

The joy of Advent is that, even though we are still waiting, we know Christ's coming among us is very near. Israel's waiting will not go on forever; the child is about to be born. And our waiting will not go on forever as Jesus' return draws near. This confident anticipation fills us with joy, a joy that lifts our hearts above the chaos of this life and prepares us to rejoice with Jesus forever.

WEEK 4 / LOVE

This week we celebrate the love of God made known to us in Jesus Christ his Son; the gift of Emmanuel, God with us.

It was for love that God took on flesh and came among us. It was for love that Jesus went to the cross. It was for love that God poured out his Spirit on the church. And it is for love that he will one day return. During Advent we give thanks for the love of God that hears our cries and does not remain far off, but draws near to rescue and redeem.
