Where:


Werribee, Victoria, Australia

I chose this weekend as it included Easter Sunday and Easter Monday. I thought that these days would bring central Werribee out to be looked at in and urban design light.





The images above are prime examples of the usual streetscape in the outer fringes of Werribee's central business districts. They consist of thin and poorly maintained footpaths with small nature strips separating pedestrians from vehicular traffic.



As we move closer to central Werribee, the foot paths become more attractive as the are now wider and more tree lined.









Now, fairly central, there are areas off the foot path that can be accessed. Small enclaves of strip shops and convenience retailers.













As we move to the out fringes the architecture becomes more sparse and foot traffic is overpowered by vehicular traffic.

Now in the fringes again, the architecture has become sheer and disengaging giving a feeling of isolation.



Now, circling back toward the city centre we can see more low rise commercial buildings and well established and located car parks as well as minimal but attractive streetscapes.



Larger more prominent buildings now occupy our view and thought these are quite commercial looking they are convenient retailers (Coles, Video Ezy and Officeworks)










Moving out of the centre we can see a diminishing of attractiveness and a rising sense of isolation.



On the fringes now, the public is predominantly used during daylight hours as there is now artificial lighting. Though it is quite sparse, the area during the day is used quite regularly, but at night is ominous and menacing.



Turning the corner and heading up the main street of Werribee we can see it open up and become quite attractive.



Still on the main street there is a large amount of healthy foliage which comes to a head at each intersection become the focal point in the form of a round about.



The use of street art on some of the round abouts creates much debate over the attractiveness of the piece, which in itself, has achieved its outcome.









Moving back from where we came from, there is a low amount of occupied buildings apart from the fast food outlet on the corner. However as we move further back into the centre there is an abundance of restaurants and a public piazza.



Now moving out of the centre, again we can see a lessening amount of retailer and restaurants. However the CBD ends, in this instance, with a well maintained and well used 'urban' park.




Much like the other areas at Werribee's fringe the areas above become dark and uninviting at night.

#### The world as a child

While moving around my two storey family home on my knees I noticed that many things became augmented and distorted but after a while I had adjusted to my diminished height. I found that there where a few everyday action and areas whose augmentation was especially noticeable.

Door became barriers and hard to use. They seemed to be designed to be ergonomic only for adults as the handle was now at my eye level, above my shoulder, making it a conscious effort.

Another noticeable augmented state was that staircases became unnavigable. I found that my only option was to crawl up them on all fours much like a cat or dog. Again the lack of ergonomic design for children appears.

Outside in the backyard, everything became bigger, I understand that this is a cliché, but I understand it now. The yakka plants that line the fence where easily navigated, where as an adult they can be quite treacherous (yakka plants are a type of cactus with very shape tipped leaves). Even the already vast concreted area of the backyard became larger and harder took longer to cross due to my lessen stride length.

# Known Places different points of view



From the child perspective we can see that their visual world is made up of mainly sky, as they are looking up for most of the time. Social props impede their view making the world seem smaller.

In the case of the adult perspective there is much more going on. There also seems to be more of the surrounding built form visible.

An idea these images gave me was that of a metaphoric one, where children's minds are less complex and busy much like there world. But, in an adult mind there are complexities such as worrying thoughts that make navigation through a thought process longer, much like there world. If we look at both of the images, which one is more complex? Or more simply, which one has more stuff? The answer is simple; the adult mind lives in a world full of so many different stimuli, some brought about by simple thoughts (loss, pain, happiness, wealth ect.) and other by visual and physical means. Therefore, looking at these images in an urban design sense; the more cluttered and disorientating a design the less enjoyable and attractive it will become, as human lives are already complex.
