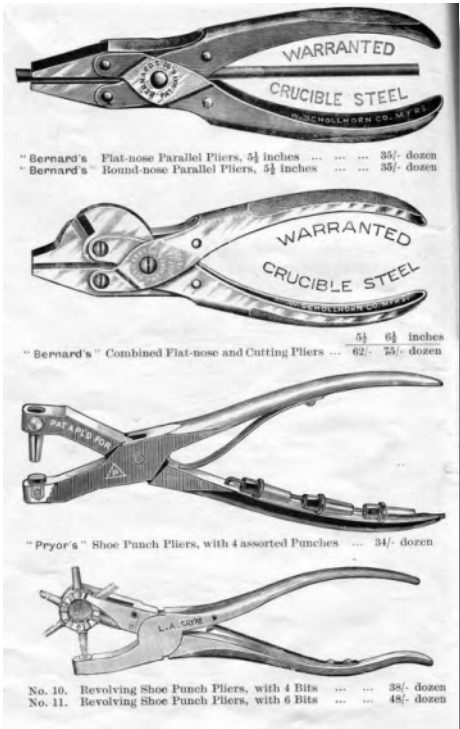

# Sharpening Demo from Tim Gray

Ryan Moritz, Jordan Steggreda, and Charlie Jenck are three carpenters/timber framers. Here they are shown getting a sharpening demo from Tim Gray. These three young men have already devoted a lot of time to learning fundamental traditional carpentry skills and all attended a traditional timber framing school on the east coast.

Ryan, originally from Juneau Alaska, met Charlie at Oregon State University in their studies of Structural Engineering. There, they found themselves involved in carpentry and timber framing projects outside of school and talked about aspirations of incorporating carpentry into their careers despite receiving upper level education. Both found themselves drawn to hand tools and inherited tools from their grandpas.

Jordan grew up in Michigan and attended a high school that focused heavily on the trades. With the dream to travel and learn from various builders, Jordan moved to Colorado and then eventually Oregon.



There, at a CNC timber frame shop, Jordan met Charlie who was there on a summer internship. While there were many skills learned that summer, both Jordan and Charlie wanted to be cutting and laying out the wood rather than simply finishing the work the machine would leave undone. Both applied to Heartwood Timber Framing School and attended the following summer.

Ryan, who had attended the program the previous summer, was working as an engineer there and the three worked developing their understanding of timber framing.

With the opportunity of a large timber frame barn back in Oregon, the three fell into business together and have been working professionally for a half a year at this point. They continue to learn great skills from experienced craftsmen like Tim Gray and other members of the PNTC and appreciate the opportunity to acquire quality tools



to keep handcrafted work alive on the west coast.

Charlie was raised in Tillamook. As his woodworking interest developed, his Grandpa Vince Bogard made his workshop available for projects. Charlie was a grateful recipient of a PNTC scholarship to attend the Timber Framing School, along with a year's PNTC membership. Vince, who has been a member of PNTC for several years, encouraged Jordan and Ryan to also become members.

# CAJUN COOKING!

If you enjoy really good Cajun food, then here are six simple recipes that will become your favorite also. In the spirit of trying new things and broadening our culture, I'm very happy to share these wonderful recipes with all of you.

### CREOLE FRANKS

- 1 Package hot dogs
- 1 - 15 oz. can tomato sauce (or 15 oz. ketchup)
- 1 - 6 oz. can pineapple juice
- 5 slices bacon
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 medium bell pepper, chopped
- Dash cayenne pepper

Cook bacon in skillet till crisp. Remove, crumble and set aside. Saute onion and bell pepper in bacon drippings till onion is clear. Add tomato sauce, bacon, juice and cayenne pepper and bring to a gentle boil. Score hot dogs crosswise four or five times and add to sauce. Reduce heat and simmer covered 15 minutes. Serve over rice.

### SHRIMP CREOLE

- 2 medium onions, finely chopped
- 2 medium bell peppers, chopped
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 3 medium-large tomatoes, peeled and chopped
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 ¼ pounds raw shrimp, peeled
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 thyme twig (¼ teaspoon dried)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- dash cayenne pepper
- dash Tabasco sauce (optional)

Saute onions and bell pepper in butter for 4 minutes. Add tomatoes, chicken stock and spices. Bring to boil and simmer 45 minutes. Add Tabasco, if desired and stir in raw shrimp. Cook about 5 minutes, till shrimp are tender. Serve over rice.

### SHRIMP OR CRAWFISH ETOUFFEE

- ½ cup butter
- ½ cup flour
- 2 cups chopped onion
- ½ cup chopped green pepper
- 2 cloves garlic, pressed or diced
- 1 ½ cups shrimp or crawfish, uncooked (or more, to taste) and peeled
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- ⅓ cup chopped green onion tops
- 1 tablespoon fresh parsley

**Roux:** Melt butter in large saucepan. Gradually stir in flour, and continue stirring constantly for about 30-45 minutes or until the roux turns a golden brown.

Stir in onions, green pepper and garlic and cook till soft, stirring occasionally.

Add shrimp and remaining ingredients. Mix well. Add 2-3 cups water and bring to a boil over medium heat. Reduce to a simmer - 30 minutes. Serve over rice, garnish with parsley.



## GRILLED OYSTERS

Raw oysters  
Bacon  
Salt and pepper to taste  
Worcestershire sauce

Dip oysters in Worcestershire sauce and then salt and pepper. Wrap each oyster in one-half slice of bacon and secure with toothpicks. Grill over charcoal (or broil, if necessary) till bacon is crispy. Serve as an appetizer or for a main course.

## FILE GUMBO

1 whole fish, cleaned and scaled  
2 pounds fresh peeled shrimp  
2 cups fresh okra, diced  
1 stick butter or margarine  
4 tablespoons flour  
1 onion  
2 sticks celery  
2 cloves garlic  
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce  
3 to 4 tablespoons file', to taste  
salt and pepper to taste  
Serves 4 to 6

Simmer whole fish in 3 quarts water and Worcestershire sauce (I put my fish in the bottom of an old (clean) nylon hose with the end tied for easy removal after cooking) for one hour. While the stock is simmering, fry okra in oil for about 10 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from skillet and set aside. Add butter or margarine and flour to skillet and stir and cook roux gently till golden brown. Chop all vegetables and add with okra to stock. Add roux to stock. Simmer all for 1 hour, add shrimp and simmer an additional 30 minutes or till shrimp are tender. Garnish with file' and serve over cooked rice.

(This recipe can be expanded many ways - add any combination of seafood or even chicken.)

## DIRTY RICE

3 cups cooked rice (your favorite recipe\*)  
¼ cup finely chopped onion  
¼ cup finely chopped bell pepper  
½ cup cooked chicken livers, chopped  
(about 1 liver per cup rice)  
1 clove garlic, diced  
1 teaspoon file'  
1-4 dashes Tabasco sauce

Cook rice according to directions. During last 10 minutes of cooking sprinkle the chopped ingredients over top of rice. **DO NOT STIR.** Cover and finish cooking rice. Add Tabasco and file' when cooking time is through and gently stir to mix all together.

\* This recipe won't work with Minute Rice!

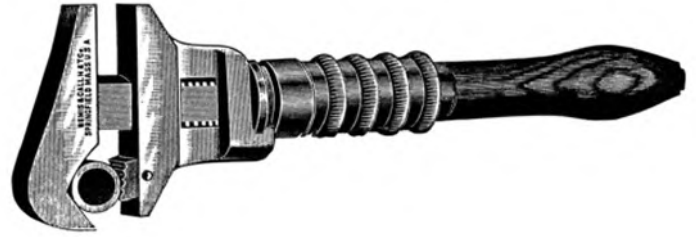

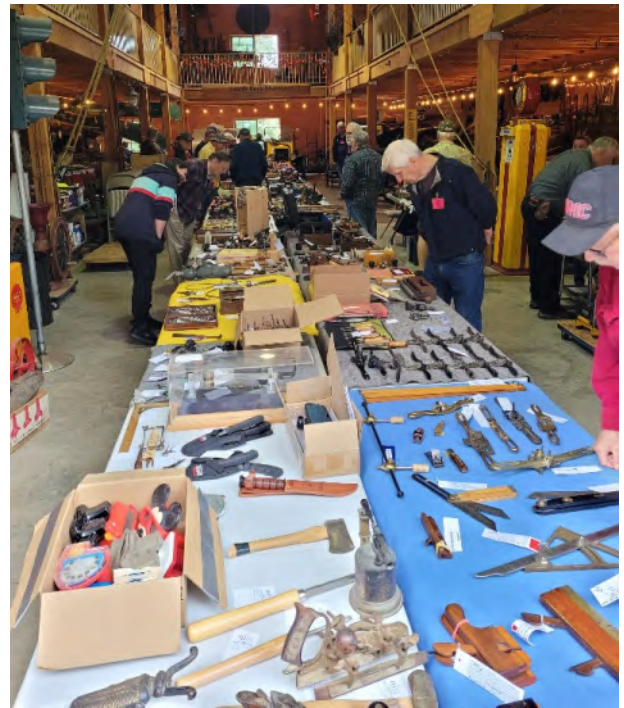

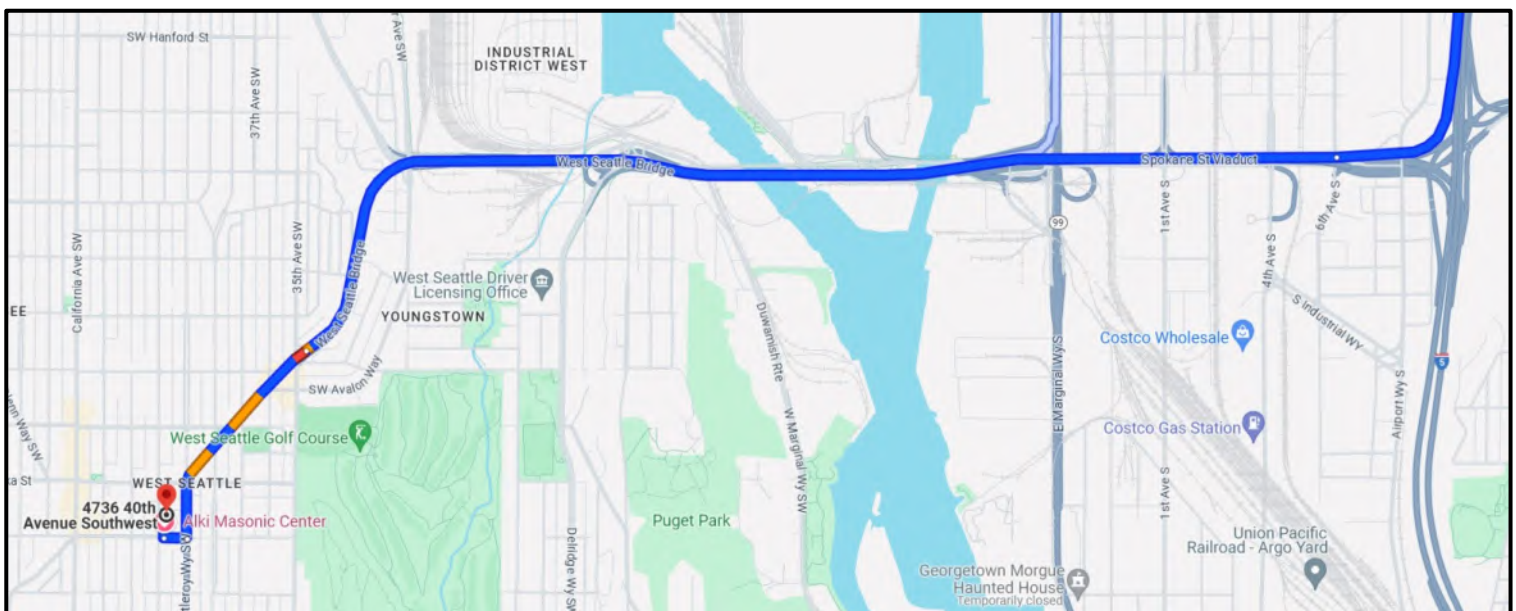


Stay in left lane for three miles (watch speed). Past the West Seattle Bridge, follow the signs to Fauntleroy Way SW and Vashon Ferry.

Come up the hill in the LEFT lane (2<sup>nd</sup> from the right). When the freeway ends at the 1<sup>st</sup> light, remain in the 2<sup>nd</sup> lane from the right, and continue straight ahead on Fauntleroy Way SW (DO NOT use the two left turn lanes).

Continue straight to the 5<sup>th</sup> light, and USE the two left turn lanes as Fauntleroy Way SW bends left, cross Alaska St. SW, continue straight.

At the end of the long block, turn right onto Edmunds St SW. Enter the parking lot on your right, in the middle of the block.
