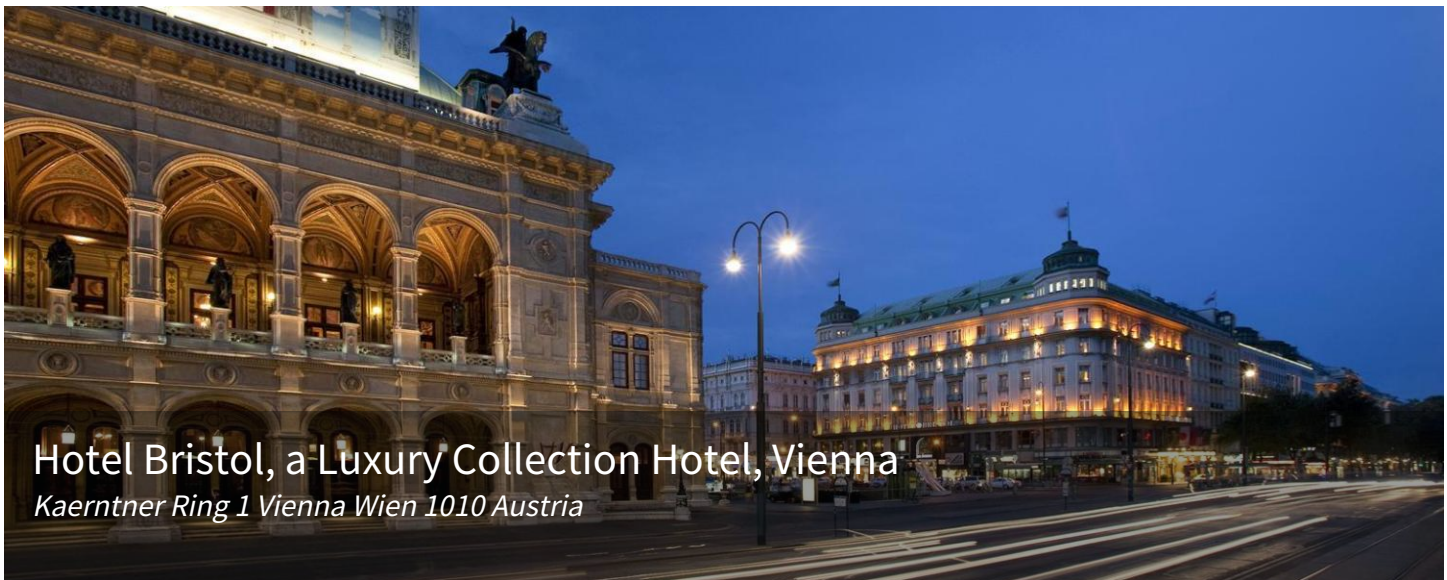

Wednesday · January 17th

Afternoon: Visit to Vienna's wine country

Visit a **Viennese Heuriger**, the uniquely Viennese style of a wine tavern. As Vienna is the world's only major city producing its wines within city limits fantastic wines, to be precise -- an evening at a Heuriger shouldn't be missed. In a comfortable and low-key atmosphere, join the Viennese as they savor the local wines and fine culinary accompaniments. At a true Heuriger, only Viennese wines are served; many world class.

These unique taverns can be found in the wine-growing regions of the city -- places like Neustift and Grinzing, or Stammersdorf and Jedlersdorf.

Thursday · January 18th

A Day of Art & Music

Vienna has been a cultural hub for centuries: it has been home to Mozart, Beethoven, Haydn and fathered the waltz, and the people's opera. Think Vienna, think the fathers of classical music. Music sings in the walls of the city, not just in its concert halls, churches and opera houses. Today will include an evening performance in one of the city's noted musical venues. Where music is, art is not far behind.

Friday · January 19th

Morning Option 1 | Orientation Walking Tour or Horse-Drawn Carriage Ride

This morning, familiarize yourself with Vienna's historic center, on a walking tour or by horse-drawn carriage. Inside the Ringstrasse, which encircles the center, Vienna will unfold its grand past. You can also take Tram #2 and travel leisurely around the Ring Strasse, or for ultimate flexibility, you might want to try a Hop-on, Hop-off sightseeing tour.

Morning Option 2 | Imperial Palace, Sisi Museum, National Library

Start exploring the center of the old city and visit Hofburg, the Imperial Palace where the Habsburg family lived during the winter months. From the 13th century until 1918, this enormous complex was the seat of the Habsburg Empire, a ruling European dynasty. In the private apartments and staterooms, you can admire the splendor and magnificence of the daily life of former days. Or visit the Sisi Museum, dedicated to the much beloved Empress Elisabeth, who has long since become a cult figure, not unlike Lady Diana. The Imperial Treasury showcases the insignia and jewels of the Holy Roman Empire and the Habsburgs.

Next door is the National Library, which will reopen to the public after January 1, 2023. It will take your breath away: it is a masterpiece of baroque architecture, soaring to a frescoed ceiling and surrounding you with a vast collection of leather-covered volumes. The royal collection features huge Italian glass globes, manuscripts and maps that pre-date the era of discovery, and handwritten works that are often on display. These museums alone will introduce you to the Imperial Life of former days.
