She started a year ago with 6 tubers, and now has multiples each of 26 different varieties! With names like Bridezilla, Beets Me and Cafe Au Lait, and sizes from tiny 2" blooms to 10" "dinner plate" varieties, dahlias offer something for everyone. Whether you put one dahlia tuber in a pot on your patio, or build an entire garden devoted to them like Susan did, everyone can enjoy the magic of these beauties.

March 20 - Deb Graham - Growing Fruit in your Backyard

Midwest Fruit Explorers is a backyard orchard society that was founded in the late 70's, here in the Chicagoland area. Members grow almost every variety of fruit that will survive in our growing zone, as well as many varieties that require winter protection. One of our founding members grew over 175 varieties of apples on dwarf trees in his Skokie backyard and didn't even eat apples! During this session you will hear about the varieties grown in Deb's home orchard and have a demonstration of tree grafting as a method of propagation used for most fruit trees.
