Data Modeling - Blog

An important tool for manufacturers in optimizing and troubleshooting their manufacturing processes is to develop mathematical models of those processes. Models aid operations staff, engineers, and managers in gaining a deeper understanding of how their manufacturing processes work and how they might be improved.

A model can be very simple, such as a graph or equation that shows the relationship between the flow rate of cooling water and the temperature of a cooled part leaving a water bath. These relationships can be theoretical or empirical, or a combination



of both inputs. Models can also be complex, incorporating relationships and interdependencies among multiple processing steps.
