\$93,823 of the funds will be used to pay for social worker salary and benefits for the 2023-24 school year. \$47,316 of the funds will be used to pay for the student health care coordinator salary and benefits for the 2023-24 school year The public is always open to attend out board meetings to voice their thoughts on what the funds should be used for. Additionally, our board members are always talking to their constituents about how the funds should be used. We discuss at every board meeting what the ESSER III funds are going to be used for based on conversations with staff, board and community. We will provide summer school for students who have been assessed and determined to have learning loss. We will also have enrichment in the summer using STEM to bring in as many students as possible for that type of enrichment. We will continue to purchase and use disinfecting products that keep our building and busses clean and as germ free as possible. Our newly hired student health care coordinator will work with students and families to provide education and support when dealing with sickness and illness. Additionally, this person is providing health care information and updates to our staff on how to prepare and deal with the cold and flu season, covid and other illnesses that arise during the school year. Our social worker continues to work diligently with students and the aftereffects of covid and all that surrounds it.

Our curriculum has been updated in many subjects and levels. Our teachers have been trained on how to use the new curriculum and our roll out has been tremendously effective with our students. We are now assessing all our students to identify learning loss and we are working with these students one on one or in small groups to catch them up. We have found that our learning loss has been much less than many schools due to the fact that we are small enough to remain in person starting the 21-22 school year. We have ramped up our SEL curriculum and support throughout the district since covid and it has paid dividends in keeping students in school and on track academically. Our administration, school board and Astoria transition committee continue to improve our plan to ensure our students and staff will be healthy and safe in a situation where we would return to an in-person school setting due to a pandemic situation.

Our plan has changed many times and will likely require adjustments, as we get closer to the first day of school. While the basis of our plan is to return to school for face-to-face education, we all understand that we are under the guidance of IDPH, CDC and the Illinois State School Board and Astoria Schools are committed to following the prescribed guidance. This plan is driven by the effort to keep our students and staff healthy and safe throughout the duration of change in educational protocol. Our protocol and policies will be driven by the IDPH, CDC and the Fulton County Health Department. Additionally, ISBE procedures and policies will be followed as prescribed. Mask usage, social distancing, personal hygiene, transportation, school and bus disinfecting, and provision of services will all be part of our safe return plan as updated every 6 months. Our social emotional and wellness of students and staff will be a high priority throughout the return to in person instruction. Meals will be provided to students free of charge and will follow the recommended health requirements.
