


SMAReach and iSMAC NND user guide

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National Neuromuscular Database (NND)



Database details

- DMD tab is for Northstar patients, SMA tab for SMA-REACH patients
- Patients can be filtered according to their ID number i.e Northstar or Smartnet number, Sponsor (primary site), party number (NHS number).
- Summary tab provides a list of completed documentation, and selected information
- Timeline tab provides a timeline of documentation completed (can view/modify past assessments)
- Documents tab allows users to download any completed documentation, including scanned forms

To enter a new patient

- Ensure that the patient has been appropriately consented to the new version 1.5 SMA-REACH as per study requirements.
- Create patient to add this patient to the database and a SMARTNET ID number is automatically generated. You will need the patient's NHS number. The number must be entered correctly as the database does not automatically check the number.
- Ensure the patient is marked as consented (green tick) on the database by clicking on the 'manage consent' field.

SMA-REACH sites - which forms to complete?

iSMAC medical/lab measures/visit forms are different from SMAREACH key and follow-up medical forms

- First visit: Complete
 - SMA-REACH key medical (KM) form
 - SMA-REACH Follow-up medical (FUM)
 - SMA-REACH PT form.
- All subsequent visits: Complete
 - SMA-REACH Follow-up medical (FUM)
 - SMA-REACH PT form
 - SMA key events form-record deaths, other significant events as required

Complete either scannable versions for later transcription or posting to Certus or non-scannable for online completion

BIOGEN ISMAC sites - which forms to complete?

Only ISMAC sites can access ISMAC forms (aka 7 UK sites)

- First visit (visit 1): Complete
 - ISMAC baseline form
 - ISMAC Lab measures
 - SMA-REACH PT form
- All subsequent visits: Complete
 - ISMAC visit form
 - ISMAC Lab measures
 - SMA-REACH PT form .
 - SMA key events form-record deaths, other significant events as required
- Complete lab measures form as required.

Reminder: if any patient is on a clinical trial please mark yes and **do not** complete any further sections on the datasets.

Please note these forms are currently online only.

They can be saved and modified as required.

PT Assessments in order of priority

ALL SITES COLLECT – WHO / VIGNOS/ ARM FUNCTION ENTRY ITEM SUMMARY FUNCTION

Non-sitters - Younger
CHOP-INTEND
HINE

Sitters - Younger RHS / HFMSE RULM HINE Non-sitters - Older RULM EK2 – UK mainly

Sitters - Older RULM EK2 – UK mainly RHS / HFMSE

Walkers – all ages RHS / HFMSE 6MWT RULM For Global Biogen ISMAC CRF's, we are aiming for all other scales listed to be performed if space is available

For Other national SMA-REACH sites we are aiming for at least one additional assessment from each of the other boxes

*For older children and adults, ability to sit independently, stand and walk are main focus

ALL PATIENTS – WHO* / VIGNOS/ ARM FUNCTION ENTRY ITEM SUMMARY FUNCTION

6MWT (W)

Valid from 30 months but can start earlier

1. RHS. 2. HFMSE (S + W)

Minimum start age 2.5 year

RULM (loss of arm function predominant)

1. CHOP-INTEND 2. HINE (NS)



7 years min

EK2 (not a W)





What assessment should I prioritise especially for MAA?

One that will pick up change Patient has room to move on scale E.g.

Being doing CHOP-INTEND
Getting stronger in supported
sitting
Start RHS as might do item 21
and 22 and soon score on item
1

Older weak non-sitter,
Could have been a type 3 or 2
Scores virtually nothing on RHS
Use RULM

Stronger Type 2 scores a point on WHO walk item for first time (5 balanced steps)

At next visit consider 6MWT

Key Points SMA Reach and ISMAC forms

Visit ID on ISMAC forms-not applicable, please enter a generic number e.g. 00 as this data is not submitted to Biogen.

Enter data **only once** if you are involved in both projects. Enter date, time, evaluator fields **only once**

It has been agreed, that if there is not available information to be entered, "-9" should be entered instead. This includes the fields: Growth, Spirometry values, Chest infections and Scoliosis values (E.g. Cobb Angle)

Always check on the clinical letters for this information.

ISMAC forms- FYI DOB, NHS number and other identifiable information are removed from the report submitted to Biogen therefore completely anonymising the data.
