APPLICANT'S PROPOSED FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

BEFORE THIS COURT is the request for findings of fact and conclusions of law of Applicant, RACHEL HANNAH HUSKINS.

Upon review of the record and proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law submitted by Applicant, and any proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law submitted by Respondent, the Court hereby adopts, makes, and enters the following:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 7. has committed acts that constitute family violence against RACHEL HANNAH HUSKINS.
- 8. did not violate the temporary ex parte order issued on August 6, 2021.
- 9. Based on the findings above, is not likely to commit family violence against RACHEL HANNAH HUSKINS in the future.

I. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

- 1. This Court is the proper venue for this suit and this Court has jurisdiction over the parties and the matters contained in the suits.
- 2. RACHEL HANNAH HUSKINS and had a dating relationship as defined by section 71.0021(b) of the Texas Family Code and were members of the same household.
- 3. committed multiple acts of family violence as defined by section 71.004(1) of the Texas Family Code.
- 4. RACHEL HANNAH HUSKINS is a victim of family violence as defined by section 71.004(1) of the Texas Family Code.
- 5. To issue a protective order, the court must find whether family violence occurred, and if family violence is likely to occur in the future. This Court found no evidence that family violence is likely to occur in the future and was required to deny the application and did so.
