BURGLARY HABITATION/BUSINESS:

3300 Spring Stuebner Rd. (IDKY Lounge) - Complainant reported that unknown suspect(s) made forced entry into the business and stole items from within.

ASSAULT:

DISTURBANCE FAMILY:

21200 Tonydale Ln. - Deputies responded to a family disturbance between husband and wife, which was verbal only; the Harris County District Attorney's Office declined charges.

3800 FM 2920 (Territory @ 2920 apts.) - Deputies responded to a disturbance between husband and wife, which turned physical, the Harris County District Attorney's Office was consulted with, and charges of assault family violence were accepted. The male was transported and booked to the Harris County jail.

3100 Beacon Grove St. - Deputies responded to a family disturbance between mom and 14-year-old son. During the investigation, it was found that the 14-year-old was having a mental episode, and he was transported to a local hospital for further evaluation.

21800 Meadowhill Dr. - Deputies responded to a disturbance that had turned physical; the Harris County District Attorney's Office was consulted, and charges were denied due to mutual combat, and the parties were separated for the night.

2900 FM 2920 (Saxon Pons apts.) - Complainant reported that he was having a verbal disturbance with her 15-year-old cousin over him turning off a Game Boy; the mother was called to pick up her child. No further action.

21700 Mileham Ln. - Deputies responded to a family disturbance between mother and son, which was verbal only; the Harris County District Attorney's Office declined charges.

2000 Spring Stuebner Rd. (Charley's Cheesesteaks) - Deputies responded to a disturbance between the Guardian and the son, no physical contact, and the Harris County District Attorney's Office declined charges.

3900 Mossy Spring Ln. - Deputies responded to a disturbance between mom and son, no physical contact, and the Harris County District Attorney's Office declined charges.

OTHER CALLS:

3400 FM 2920 (BoBas smoke shop) - Complainant reported a customer came into the business yelling and having a mental episode. The male was transported to a local hospital for a mental evaluation.

20900 Tonydale Ln. - Complainant reported that unknown suspect(s) had obtained her personal information to open a bank account.

1700 Spring Stuebner Rd. (Bass Pro) - Loss prevention reported that a w/m suspect came into the store and opened a line of credit using someone else's identity. Purchases made by the suspect were declined, and he fled the scene.

4100 Mossy Spring Ln. - Complainant reported that her 13-year-old granddaughter ran away from home and has yet to return.

21900 Hannover Village Ct. - Complainant reported that her 10-year-old daughter had missed school intentionally and did not know her whereabouts. After a brief search, the child was in good condition.

2400 Green Fern Ct. - Complainant reported that his two children had been in the custody of the mother, who is now divorced and refusing visitation, both sides claiming the other is a bad parent. Both parties were referred to a family court.

4200 Spring Stuebner Rd. (Vale apts.) - Complainant reported that her 3-year-old child had been in custody of the father, who is now divorced and refusing visitation, both sides claiming the other is a bad parent. Both parties were referred to a family court.

21700 Longcastle Dr. - Deputies responded to a death investigation where it was found that an elderly female was deceased due to natural causes.

3000 Aspen Fair Trl. - Complainant reported that he was receiving threats via cell phone from an unknown suspect.

21700 Mileham Ln. - Complainant reported that she was involved in a disturbance with her son, who made threats to harm her, and the Harris County District Attorney's Office was consulted, and charges of Terroristic Threats to a family member were accepted. Son was booked into the Harris County jail.

21800 Holzwarth Rd. (Smart Stop Self Storage) - Mgr. reported that two males came into the store and were just casing the interior of the office. Became irate when asked if they needed help and fled in a vehicle.

3900 FM 2920 - Deputy arrived at a stalled vehicle on the public roadway. During the driver identification process, he was found to have an active Harris County warrant.

21600 Falvel Lake Dr. - Complainant reported that she located a tracking device on her vehicle and believes it was placed on her vehicle by her soon-to-be ex-husband.

3900 Mossy Spring Ln. - Complainant reported that while picking up his son from the ex-wife, an argument started, and she threw a vape and struck him.

3900 Mossy Spring Ln. - Father made a repeat call that his son had been struck by the ex-wife in anger. Mother claims this was false; the Harris County District Attorney's Office declined to file charges, and Child Protective Services was contacted.

21600 Spring Plaza Dr. - A traffic stop was conducted on a vehicle for a traffic violation. It was found that the driver did not have a driver's license or proof of financial responsibility. The driver was cited and released, and the vehicle was impounded.

3400 FM 2920 - A traffic stop was conducted on a vehicle for traveling 107 MPH. The Harris County District Attorney's Office accepted a reckless driving charge, and the driver was booked into the Harris County jail.

4000 Falvel Cove Dr. - complainant reported that her 10-year-old had not arrived home from school. Once located, the 10-year-old stated that she had been abducted. The investigation found that the 10-year-old made up the story.

22100 Greengate Dr. - Deputies responded to a report of a dog hit by a vehicle. It was found that the dog owner was not on a leash and the dog was running loose.

2900 FM 2920 (Saxon Pond apts.) - Complainant reported that an ex-girlfriend kept calling from a cell phone despite being told to stop. The officer contacted the female and warned her to stop all contact.

2200 Spring Stuebner Rd. (7-11) - Store clerk reported that an unknown white powdery substance was

found in the parking lot. The deputy seized it and submitted it for destruction.

Deputies conducted a series of proactive safety and security measures to enhance community well-being and law enforcement visibility. Welfare checks were conducted to ensure the safety of vulnerable residents, while park checks aimed to maintain a secure, crime-free environment for visitors. Contract checks reinforced security in designated areas under specific agreements, strengthening law enforcement presence.

Public infrastructure and MUD building checks were also carried out to protect critical facilities from vandalism and unauthorized access. Neighborhood checks facilitated routine patrols and direct engagement with community members, promoting safety and fostering trust. Vacation checks provided an added layer of security for unoccupied residences, reducing the risk of property crimes.

Traffic safety initiatives and enforcement efforts were also key focus areas. Deputies conducted traffic stops to ensure compliance with regulations, mitigate hazardous driving behaviors, and enhance the safety of both pedestrians and motorists throughout the neighborhood. These collective efforts aimed to uphold public safety, deter crime, and reinforce community confidence in law enforcement.
