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# TACT-2 TRAINING

# THERAPEUTIC AGGRESSION CONTROL TECHNIQUES

Therapeutic Aggression Control Techniques (TACT2) is a trauma-sensitive staff training program in behavior management, crisis de-escalation, and physical intervention. Enhanced to include extensive information on adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), TACT2 develops the skills to manage misbehaviors while enhancing relationships with troubled children and youth. Because of its comprehensive content, TACT2 is most often offered in group homes, residential treatment, shelters, and alternative schools which serve higher-risk youth.

# Day 1

teaches staff to distinguish between deliberate, purposeful aggression vs. true emotional crisis, delving into the psychological and neurological impact of childhood trauma and ACEs.

# Day 2

- provides instruction in practical crisis management skills, such as behavioral correction, de-escalation, and active listening skills, as well as exploring self-care strategies for staff to minimize the effects of their own ACEs.
- teaches safe and effective physical management techniques for handling immediately dangerous situations without further traumatizing youth.

# Recertification

TACT-2 recertification is a 6 hour in-person refresher training and should be repeated annually to maintain skills and techniques

# **Professional Development**

### **Prevention Before Intervention**

This three hour workshop is designed strengthen to relationship between teachers and teacher's aides by highlighting their roles and responsibilities, strengths and weaknesses and showing the importance of the partnership between the two. This workshop combines project learning and collaborative partnership learning.

# **Turning Down the Heat**

A six hour program designed to prevent conflict in the classroom by helping staff identify and resist the urge to become counter aggressive with students. TDTH helps staff recognize their own personal warning signs. Recognizing when are starting to become escalated and recognizing your personal symptoms is a key first in combating step aggression. However, TDTH goes deeper and teaches participants to use positive self-talk in order to cognitively engage in actively defending against counter aggressive thoughts and actions.

# **Building Skills in Behavior** Management

This three hour training is geared toward new staff or staff that could use a refresher in the basic principles of behavior management. This course focuses on behaviors, their origins and why they occur.
