WHAT IS A COST OF COMMUNITY SERVICES STUDY?

The study measures the fiscal relationship, or ratio, between revenues and expenditures. The revenues and expenditures are allocated into residential, commercial/industrial, and farm/agricultural land uses. The ratio is then calculated for all three types of land uses.

WHY DO A COST OF COMMUNITY SERVICES STUDY?

Stakeholders seek to understand the ratio of expenditures to revenues when faced with land use decisions. A cost of community services study outlines where the government spends more on services provided, as compared with the revenues generated.



Commercial and agricultural land generate more revenue for a community than what is spent on services.

Residential land costs more for community services than the revenue it generates.
