Haubner Road is located in California, Kentucky and is named after the first Haubner that settled in the area sometime in the 1800's. Years of large scale farming took place on the fields including tobacco and hay. Over many years, multiple types of crops were harvested and sold to market. Our Haubner ancestors worked sun up to sun down and we have full respect for the amount of hard work they incorporated day in and day out. All farmers - men and women - built America.

Our family is now the 6th generation to farm the family property. We are hobby gardeners and the homegrown produce we grow and preserve feeds us throughout the summer and into the winter. We have been blessed to continue to work the multigenerational family farm. We continue to grow vegetables, potatoes and raise chickens for our family to enjoy.

We are excited for the family property to feature a new crop on Haubner Road - flowers. **Homegrown on Haubner Hill** is a newly established small-scale flower farm, created for on-farm events such as u-picks and workshops along with grower bucket orders and DIY options. 2024 is our inaugural year as a flower farm.

We hope by bringing you to the farm for u-pick events and workshops, you can enjoy a bit of the country. We believe that flowers make people, bees, and butterflies happy, and we strive to bring joy to our visitors through the beauty of our fields. A majority of the flowers were started from a tiny little seed, right here on the farm. The flower field is approximately 1/8 of an acre (with room to grow) and over 50 flower varieties have been chosen to bring life into the flower field, including the heirloom zinnia seed, "Grandma's Zinnia's" named after Grandma Ann Haubner who was an impressive flower grower.

Our practices are sustainable and we strive to be good land stewards. We are incorporating a regenerative mindset into the flower (and vegetable) gardens - rebuilding the soil and working with nature to maximize its health and ecosystem.

We hope to educate and empower other busy families like us - demonstrating that no matter how big or small you have it, all you need is a little bit of soil (along with some water and sun). The importance of growing your own food and being sustainable is a great skill, one we hope our children and their children continue to teach generation to generation.
