



# Campbell County Conservation District Local Cost Share Programs

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The Campbell County Conservation District's Local Cost-Share Program is intended to assist Campbell County landowners to be good stewards of the land. This program offers financial and technical assistance to implement Kentucky's Agriculture Water Quality best management practices, which improve soil and water quality, as well as wildlife habitat.

- Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received.
- Households can receive funding once per fiscal year.
- This is a 50% match reimbursement cost-share program up to the maximum amount for the selected cost share, if the terms are fulfilled.
- The cost share program continues until funds are depleted. Approved applications depend on the funding allocated to the program for that fiscal year.
- Participants are expected to maintain Urban Agriculture projects for at least three years, and Agriculture cost shares for at least five years.
- Misusing funds will result in removal from the program and may disqualify the participant from future CCCD programs.
- Please submit photographs and receipts with an expense sheet.
- NO EXTENSIONS WILL BE GRANTED
- At the board's discretion, the application will be reviewed for approval by the Board of Supervisors. The applicant will be notified by email. Once the best management practice is completed, submit photos and receipts to the office for the board's review. Septic system repair - Farmstead BMP #2 (tank and leech field repair)	
Water harvesting – Farmstead BMP #5 (water collection for livestock and crops)	
Pasture and hay land planting and management – Crops BMP #9 (establish/maintain pasture and hay land)	
Cover crops – Crops BMP #13 (establish cover on bare soil after row cropping)	
Planned grazing systems – Livestock BMP #1 (divides pasture into smaller sizes for grazing)	
Limiting access to surface water - Livestock BMP #4 (fencing around ponds, streams, etc.)	
Manure storage structure – Livestock BPM #10 (stack pads)	
Feeding and heavy use area – Livestock BMP #14 (protecting soil from erosion via appropriate materials)	

<b>Dead animal disposal</b> – Livestock BMP # 15 (proper composting or burying of animal mortalities)	
<b>Stormwater management systems</b> – Livestock BMP #18 (divert rainwater via gutters, outlets, ditches, and storage vessels).	

Terms: Receipts dated prior to the approval letter date will not be considered for reimbursement. Funds for local cost shares are made available through the Campbell County Conservation District.

\*\*Applications must include the property owner. Applicable zoning and building permits are the responsibility of the property owner.
