

# Spawning salmon scuppered by gravel build-up



5 ome time ago it was discovered that the Ettrick river is completely blocked with gravel downstream from Gamescleuch in upper Ettrick. The gravel had built up over a period of time with logs and debris all contributing to the river bed being completely blocked for over 100 metres. The river water is filtering across to the other side of the Ettrick Marshes through small channels and then filtering back to rejoin the river bed further downstream at the Hopehouse burn near Honey Cottage. Over several visits it has been clear that the gravel blockage is growing all the time as more is deposited.

As well as causing flood water to back up, the blockage is preventing salmon from getting upstream to their spawning grounds - a big problem given that the Ettrick Water is a crucial spawning ground for salmon in the wider Tweed river system.

#### Good news ahead

The good news is that the blockage is now going to be cleared! SBC and the Tweed Commission have come together to organise clearing the river bed and hope to have the work completed over the summer. The work will be carried out by SBC Contracts and will start as soon as the required licences and budget are in place. The start date should be in the next month and is expected to cost around £30,000. It can't come soon enough for the

residents up Ettrick as well as the fish!


# **Cracking month for Kirkhope pupils**

Ending the afternoon session, Peter Forrest cast the town's colours along to the children singing "Up wi' the Souters".

# **More** road closures on the way

The Top Swire (B709 between Tushielaw and the Gordon Arms) will be closed at Berrybush from Tuesday 1st July to Tuesday 8th July 8am to 6pm. It will then be closed again from Tuesday 22nd July to Tuesday 5th August. This has been requested by Scottish Woodland for roadside tree felling. (See map below).

- The A708 will be closed at Muchra for surface dressing between 9am and 5pm for 3 days from the 16th June.
- The C22 (bottom swire) road between Yarrow and Kirkhope has a weight restriction of 7.5

tonnes applied until 9th July. And remember the bridge in Ettrickbridge has the same weight restriction while rebuilding work continues.

- The B7009 between Singlie and Gilmanscleuch will be closed for 2 days on the 12th June for resurfacing work (weather dependent)
- From 19th June for one day the B711 road from Ettrick to Roberton will be closed for resurfacing near East Buccleuch, and again on the 20th and 23rd June at Alemoor (7.30am to 5.30pm).

Changes afoot at former Ettrick Primary School?

Ettrick school was closed in 2012 with pupils transferred to Kirkhope Primary and since then the school has been managed by the Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company (EYCDC) where they currently have an office, host the James Hogg Exhibition and hire out electric bikes.

The playground is used by campervans for a small fee and there is also a large classroom with sofas and a woodburning stove for community gettogethers.

However, the old building could do so much more with a few adaptations! First on the list is a borehole in the school grounds as the supply is currently shared with five houses as well as the Boston Hall and struggles in dry weather.

The old boys cloakroom could become a bunkroom providing accommodation to walkers on the Southern Upland Way, cyclists, helpers in the Marshes or even a writer in residence. It is suggested that the old girls cloakroom should remain but be converted into a shower room.

Camping could be promoted in the school gardens with access to the toilet at the back door.

Disabled access could be added to a new entrance at the rear of the main classroom with an added decking area.

A wood-clad shipping container added in the school grounds could hold the eBikes and a mounted PV array and battery to reduce electricity bills.

Finally the plumbing and heating system needs to be renewed so that the building can be used throughout the winter months without the fear of pipes freezing.

The aim is to make the building more usable as a community hub while reducing costs. This might all have to be done in stages but EYCDC would like to hear your views on these plans and any other suggestions for improvements. Contact us at: info@ettrickandyarrow.org.uk

If you are one of the many who enjoy visiting Bowhill during the summer months, you'll notice a few changes as the house and grounds open for the new season this year. ▲ Bowhill Grounds will be open daily from Sunday 1st June to Sunday 31st August

This spring marks the final stage of the Bowhill driveway improvements, bringing a landscaped one-way system, a brand-new General's Bridge Car Park, additional tree planting, and the installation of new gates at the visitor entrance.

#### What Does This Mean For You?

- During Bowhill's open season, entry will be managed via the kiosk as usual. Season open dates and entry prices can be found here.
- Outside of the open season, when Bowhill is closed to the general public, the gates will be closed to vehicles. Visitors at these times can park in the General's Bridge Car Park (parking charge applies), located just opposite the kiosk.
- Annual Pass Holders will enjoy year-round access to the Grounds and main car park via the vehicle gates, which will open with vehicle registration technology as well as the physical Annual Pass card.
