

The Ettrick flows again

ast month we reported that the diggers had arrived to clear the huge blockage in the river Ettrick several miles above the Honey Cottage caravan park. Gravel and tree trunks had built up over a few years leading to a huge stretch of the river being completely blocked. This meant that salmon were no longer able to reach their spawning grounds above the blockage and the build up was continuing to worsen every month.

The River Tweed Commissioners with the help of Scottish Borders Council and the Nature Restoration Fund stepped up. It was a difficult section to access but after a few minor mishaps, the digger men prevailed and the river is now flowing freely again! Good news for the salmon and who knows, maybe the road will flood less frequently?



A glut of apples?

Well, here's a solution put forward by Oxana Jones, Proprietor of The Gordon Arms Restaurant with Rooms, Yarrow – a nonosense Apple Crumble Cake. Simple, speedy, and very good at disappearing from the plate.



Apple Crumble Cake

Ingredients:

- Eggs 4
- Sour cream 400 g
- Butter (melted) 160 g
- Sugar 250 g
- Baking powder 10 g (= 2 tsp)
- Flour (sifted) 500 g
- Apples 4, peeled and chopped into small cubes (any variety)
- •.Vanilla 2 tsp

Method:

- 1. Mix together eggs, sugar, sour cream, and melted butter.
- 2. Add baking powder and flour, mix into a soft, slightly runny dough.

Assembly:

Grease a rectangular baking dish
 ~ 40 cm x 20 cm (or 2 x round
 moulds).

- Pour in half of the dough.
- Spread the chopped apples evenly over the top.
- Sprinkle with vanilla or vanilla sugar (or cinnamon, if preferred).
- Pour the remaining half of the dough on top.

Crumble:

- Mix together:
- 100 g flour
- 100 g sugar
- 80 g butter (softened)
- Rub into crumbs and sprinkle evenly over the top.

Baking:

- Preheat oven to 180°C.
- Bake for 40–45 minutes until fully cooked through.
- Let cool slightly before serving.

Well, well, well...

The old primary school in Ettrick has been managed by the Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company (EYCDC) since it closed its doors in 2012. Both it and the Boston Hall (as well as

other neighbours) share a private water supply from a spring on the nearby hill.

As part of the project to upgrade the old school, the EYCDC plans to install a borehole in the school garden. Funding to drill the well has now been received from the Community Led Local Development Fund and work will start within the next few months.

More funding will be required to install the pumping equipment and the search is on to make up the difference.

The option for the Boston Hall to share access to the borehole is available and the new well will also provide a clean, reliable source of water for everyone living nearby should we have another very dry summer.



■ The change of use planning application to convert the old boys toilets in the old school to a small bunkroom has been submitted and is currently on the SBC planning portal. Also proposed is a disabled access ramp to the rear of the building.

■ The Community Led Local Development grant is funded by Scottish Ministers in conjunction with Scottish Borders Council, as the Lead Partner for the Local Action Group.
