After Dutch Elm disease 'Survivor Elms' provide hope

A Royal hunt leads to ...the Ettrick Marshes

utch Elm disease has devasted elm trees right across Britain but a few 'survivor' elms are to be found in the Ettrick Marshes. A survivor elm is an old tree which has been exposed to the disease (there are dead ones close by) but has survived.

The Royal Botanic Gardens has been on the hunt for these trees and last year, Ettrick Marshes ranger Tommy Bryson, was ready to help. He showed them the trees, helped them collect cuttings and pollen, and has been growing some of his own from seed.

The Botanic Gardens grew around 200 trees from their collection in the Marshes, with some of these seedlings being used to repopulate sites in the Highlands.

Last month the team from the Botanics came back and Tommy helped them plant 50 young elm trees back in the Marshes where they can link up with their 'mother' tree and hopefully prove to be resistant.

Sauna nice to see you - to see you nice!

locations are featured: Kirk Loch, Lochmaben, and Loch of the Lowes, St Mary's Loch, described by Mhairi as "a truly special Sauna Spot ... the perfect place to relax, recharge and reconnect with nature."

The Sauna will return to The Loch of the Lowes on May 10th/11th and even if the weather is cold, you'll get a warm welcome. As Mhairi says, "What's better than turning up for a cold swim in the rain at one of the most remote spots in the South of Scotland and

Bridge Restriction

Battle of the bulge...

The bridge in Ettrickbridge will have a weight restriction of 7.5 tonnes for at least six weeks from 8am on the 6th May. This is for essential masonry repair work and drainage improvements.

The work will involve taking down and rebuilding a bulging section of wall on the South West corner of the bridge below the level of the road and extending around 12 metres in length. The work is being carried out by SBContracts and is expected to take around six weeks. This work has been needed for some time so despite the inconvenience, its good that it is finally being done. The road will then be resurfaced later in the year.

History of the Bridge

Sir Walter Scott of Harden built a bridge of three arches over

the gorge at Kirkhope in 1628 and set a panel with his coat

of arms into the parapet. The design was faulty and by 1715 this bridge had failed. It was not replaced until 1780 when the present single span bridge was built (and then widened on the downstream side in 1858). Scott of Harden's panel is still there below the parapet on the upstream side of the bridge but in more recent years a newer replica of it was set into the facing wall of the bridge by Robert Maguire and the community council -which is much easier to see!

He says: "Grown just steps from the kitchen, this tart and vibrant beauty marks the true beginning of spring here in the Yarrow



Rhubarb and **Honey Jelly**

f you too have a glut of rhubarb here's an easy recipe to use some of it up in a delicious coral pink pudding. (Mrs Gladys Prickle's recipe for Rhubarb & Honey Jelly)

- 2lbs of fresh rhubarb cut into 2" lengths
- 3 tablespoons of honey
- 1½ oz of gelatine
- 2 tablespoons of gin (optional)
- 1) Put the rhubarb in a pan with three tablespoons water and cook gently until soft for about 30 mins.
- 2) Strain into a measuring jug there should be about 1 ½ pints of juice.
- 3) Stir the honey into the hot juice.
- 4) Soak the gelatine in the gin, and then add to the still warm juice and stir until the gelatine is dissolved.
- 5) Pour into a bowl or individual glasses and chill for around 4
- 6) Serve topped with cream and flaked almonds.


in the Adventure Playground and gardens and then recharge in the Old Kitchen Café.
