Te are delighted to bring you the first edition of The EYE. We begin with a very topical issue regarding forestry that threatens to impact the Ettrick Marshes over the critical summer breeding and tourist season..

Vicky Davidson, Project Manager for the Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company recently reported that very short notice had been given to a forestry felling operation which directly impacts on the Ettrick Marshes boardwalk facility.

"We found out at the end of last week that FLS (Forestry and Land Scotland) are planning to fell the hillside directly behind the Honey Cottage Caravan Park in Ettrick from the boundary with Annelshope along to the first bird hide - barring a section in the middle. These trees come right down to the side of the boardwalk. They have sold the trees already and we were told that the felling would start before the end of May. We were not notified or consulted even though the public path runs all the way along beneath these trees.

"We met with FLS on site to point out that this was the worst possible time to fell these trees we will have to close the board walk just as we head into summer. This will directly affect the caravan park and the café as the felling work will go on for 3-4 months. It is also breeding season for birds and red squirrels. I have to say that our representations fell on deaf ears as the trees are already sold. We have since heard that the felling is due to start in mid June.

"We pointed out that there had been no community consultation or even a courtesy note to EYCDC as the

adjacent owners. We are very concerned that the felling work could damage the boardwalk as well as the birdhide. We also pointed out that their most recent felling behind Gamescleuch has removed the connecting path that linked our land to the forest road leading down to Tima. This means that until that bit of path is restored by FLS, there will be no access to the Marshes from either end all summer.

The Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company (EYCDC) has been operating in the valleys for over 10 years. Projects include redeveloping the old farm steading at Kirkhope into five affordable homes to rent and a business unit with seven lettable spaces.

We also own and manage the Ettrick Marshes, one of

Scotland's largest wetland restoration projects and an important conservation area which includes an extensive boardwalk along the fringe of the Marshes and two bird hides.

We are still in the process (after many years) of taking ownership of the old Ettrick Primary School where we run the James Hogg Exhibition, occasional workshops, office space, hire out electric bikes and provide an overnight stopping point for campervans in the playground. We are currently looking at further improvements to the building.

Other projects include completing a circular walking route around St Mary's Loch and reopening the Captain's Road walking route which links both valleys from St Mary's Loch in Yarrow over the hill to Hopehouse in Ettrick. We are currently looking at providing a safe off-road walking route from Kirkhope to Ettrickbridge.

Membership of EYCDC is open to all residents who are 16 or over and live within the valley postcodes. You can be an associate member if you live outside these postcodes. We currently have 296 members and associate members. If you would like to join, please contact EYCDC for a membership application form – cost £1.



Caravan Park. Ideal to combine with a walk in the Ettrick Marshes or a visit to the James Hogg Exhibition.





Lbright red EYCDC electric 7 seater minibus on roads up and down the valleys. It is often used by the two valley schools when it is not on EYCDC business.



If you have no access to a car or driver, it can be booked with one of our volunteer drivers to take you to an essential appointment or for a special group outing. It can also be loaned to valley residents over 25 with a clean driving licence in return for a donation and must be returned charged.


