People power postpones felling plans

le start with good news to report. The felling at Gamescleuch Forest above the Ettrick Marshes conservation area has now been postponed until mid-September. This means that the community boardwalk and paths in the Ettrick Marshes can remain open all summer and our red squirrels can continue to breed in peace!

We're pleased to report that Forest and Land Scotland listened to all the representations from the community and backed down over the felling dates. Local residents wrote with their concerns to NatureScot, MSPs, bosses at FLS, the Community Woodland Association, the Forest Policy Group and local wildlife groups. We even discovered that the Scottish Parliament has a Red Squirrel Champion who wrote on our behalf! Well done to everyone who took time to write asking for the delay until after the breeding and visitor season.

David Robertson, Returning Officer for the Berwickshire, Roxburgh and Selkirk Constituency, said:

"People across the Borders need to vote with an 'X' at this election. I would encourage voters to study the ballot paper instructions carefully, but polling station staff will be able to help with any queries they may have.

"I'd like to remind voters that they must take photographic identification or a Voter Authority Certificate with them when they go to vote, this is essential as they will not be able to vote without either of these documents. It will also speed up the process if they take their poll cards with them, but this is not a requirement, and they can vote without it.

"The best way to submit postal votes is via the Royal Mail, they must reach us by 10pm on the day of the count,

4 July. If voters are in any doubt that their vote will not reach us on time, they can hand them in to polling stations on the day of polling or into the Council headquarters in Newtown St Boswells in advance of the election.

"The earlier we receive postal votes the faster the process is for counting them on Thursday night."

Voting takes place on Thursday 4 July, between 7am and 10pm, with the count taking place overnight once the polls close.

Voters are being encouraged to check where they will vote. Details of their local polling station is on their poll card and can also be found at www. wheredoivote.co.uk.

Small but inspiring...



You can play without booking but please put a donation of £5 in the box. EFSRC also manage the Ettrickbridge sports field and are currently seeking funding to install a Petanque Piste. What's that you ask? It's a sandy type of surface for playing the French game of boules – where you throw your boule (ball) to try and get nearest to the jack (small ball). It's a great game for all ages!!

You can play tennis for free not just in Wimbledon weeks but all year round if you join EFSRC. Membership fees are deliberately kept low to try and encourage as many people as possible to join the club. The membership fees help pay for the annual insurance which is not insubstantial, but necessary to make sure that everyone who uses the field, tennis court and other facilities are covered.

The James Hogg Exhibition celebrating the life and work of this prolific and influential local author is a permanent exhibition in the old Ettrick Primary School which opens in the summer every Wednesday, Friday and Sunday afternoons from 2-5pm.

His masterwork is 'The Private Memoirs and Confessions of a Justified Sinner' which was published 200 years ago this month. It is regarded as one of the defining texts of Scottish literature with Scottish writers like Ian Rankin and James Robertson citing it as a major inspiration. The 'Confession' charts descent into madness of the main character, Robert, with psychotic delusions leading to murder. Set in Calvinist Scotland, Robert believes in predestination and thinks he is one of God's saved, and his actions are therefore 'justified'. Within the novel, the 'Confession' is discovered in the pocket of a body preserved in peat in the hills above Ettrick and Hogg uses local place names from both valleys in much of his writing. The

site of the supposed grave where the 'Confession' is found is at Cowan's Croft above Berrybush between both valleys.

James Hogg: Confessions of a Justified Sinner

n the seventeenth century Yarrow was the scene of religious dissent; presbyterian Covenanter preachers and their followers were forbidden to attend church services so were forced to worship outdoors, often huddling in blankets for protection from the elements. The annual open-air service in the churchyard near Yarrow commemorates this period in history. The service will be led by Rev. Jim Wallace at 3pm, followed by teas in St Mary's Hall at Cappercleuch.
