


### **Bollywood comes to the Borders**

### Clean water on tap...

cottish Water's planned Dexamination of the drinking water in the Yarrow Feus area of Selkirk to undertake a new water treatment process is currently underway and is aimed at improving water resilience and quality. It is expected to be completed by the second week in September.

Originally, the switch to a new treatment process, called Chloramination, was scheduled for May but this was delayed to allow for essential network upgrades.

Caledonia Water Alliance is carrying out the work on behalf of Scottish Water.

During the switch to Chloramination, residents might notice a change in water pressure or some discoloration in their water. If this occurs, just turn on the cold water tap in your kitchen and let it run slowly until the water clears.

### Yarrow Show 2024

The long-established and popular Yarrow Show, (this is the 102nd annual show) is taking place at Carterhaugh this year. It's in the field next to Bowhill on the road nearest Selkirk which links the two valleys.

The Yarrow and Ettrick Pastoral Society Annual Show (to give it it's full title!) is a competitive local show with lots of classes including always a big turn out of horses and ponies. Some of the top cheviot and blackface sheep breeders in the country farm in the Ettrick and Yarrow valleys so the sheep judging is a serious business starting at

Other classes include field and garden produce, the flower show, baking, craft items and walking sticks – with all these special entries available to view in the industrial and craft tents. The dog and pet show is open to entries on the field

and includes, 'dog most like its owner', and 'dog the judges would most like to take home' as well as 'best household pet (any variety) for 12 yrs and under.' The

children's dog handler class is split between 10vrs and under and 10-16 yrs.

Further attractions include childrens' races, lots of stalls to wander around, big machinery, vintage tractors, ice-cream, catering, and the beer tent. Ed Strang-Steel will be doing the commentating and this year's president, Gibby Findlater, will be presiding.

Admission is £10 per adult (incl. car parking), concessions £5 and Under 16s free.



### Lest we forget...

Back in the late nineties, John Nichol of the Hot Trod Theatre Company decided he would like to tell the story of Sir James Douglas – the 'Good Sir James' to the Scots, and the 'Black Douglas' to

those south of the border. The play was, however, written, put aside, rewritten, put aside again, many times over the years.

However, last year, both lain Fraser and Alistair Pattullo (John's fellow HotTrodders) declared themselves enthusiastic about the idea and so the final adaptation of *El Duglas* quickly evolved.

Why El Duglas? Every year, in the Andalucian town of Teba, an event is held in honour of the heroic deeds of Sir James Douglas who fought and died there in the Battle of Teba in 1330 whilst en route to the Holy Land with the embalmed heart of his friend, Robert the Bruce. Sir James was Bruce's ablest lieutenant

and the most professional soldier of his day, whose menacing resourcefulness and outright genius undoubtedly led to victory in the Scottish Wars of Independence.

The show begins with Juan coming in from the Andalucian sunshine to take a break from his role as Sir James

Douglas, just after a parade through the streets of Teba during the Douglas Day celebrations. Removing his surcoat, Juan becomes the Bruce, who then takes up the story...

The Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company (EYCDC) has been operating in the valleys for over 10 years. Projects include redeveloping the old farm steading at Kirkhope into five affordable homes to rent and a business unit with seven lettable spaces.

We also own and manage the Ettrick Marshes, one of Scotland's largest wetland restoration projects and

an important conservation area which includes an extensive boardwalk along the fringe of the Marshes and two bird hides.

We are still in the process (after many years) of taking ownership of the old Ettrick Primary School where we run the James Hogg Exhibition, occasional workshops, office space, hire out electric bikes and provide an overnight stopping point for campervans in the playground. We are currently looking at further improvements to the building.

Other projects include completing a circular walking route around St Mary's Loch and reopening the Captain's Road walking route which links both valleys from St Mary's Loch in Yarrow over the hill to Hopehouse in Ettrick. We are currently looking at providing a safe off-road walking route from Kirkhope to Ettrickbridge.

Membership of EYCDC is open to all residents who are 16 or over and live within the valley postcodes. You can be an associate member if you live outside these postcodes. We currently have 298 members and associate members. If you would like to join, please contact EYCDC for a membership application form – cost £1.
