All change at the **EYCDC**

The December AGM of the Ettrick and Yarrow Community **Development Company marked** a new chapter in the community charity as long-standing chairman, Sir Michael Strang Steel stood down after ten successful years at the helm. The regeneration charity which has over 300 members living in or near the valleys marked the occasion with a retrospective film show of the projects the EYCDC has delivered over that time, the largest by far being the five new houses and the new business centre which has transformed the old stone steading at Kirkhope near Ettrickbridge.

Other projects include the Ring of the Loch walking path around St Mary's Loch, the re-opening of the Captain's Road linking the two valleys, taking ownership and reinstating the boardwalk and paths in the Ettrick Marshes, keeping the old Ettrick School building open as a base,

Jeremy is replaced by Bronwyn Clark from Meggethead who has experience of providing this role with other development charities.

New directors welcomed onto the EYCDC board are Colin Robson from Ettrickbridge, Ingrid Earp from Hopehouse in Ettrick valley and continuing directors are Lynne Hume, Andy Wright, Marjorie Hutton and Alison Renwick.

Pupils visit centre for World Peace – at Eskdalemuir!



he P4-7 class of Kirkhope Primary school enjoyed a fascinating visit to the Kagyu Samye Ling Monastery and Tibetan Buddhist Centre at Eskdalemuir near Langholm last week. Founded in 1967 the Centre is located on the banks of the river Esk.

Kagyu Samye Ling was the first Tibetan Buddhist Centre

to have been established in the West. Currently under the guidance of Abbot Choje Lama Yeshe Losal Rinpoche, it's aim is to be a centre for World Peace and health through the development of "unconditional kindness, compassion and forgiveness".

ast week's Code Red weather event - Storm Eowyn - caused havoc throughout Scotland, including the Ettrick and Yarrow Valleys, with trees felled, blocking roads and downing power lines.

An Impressive army of chainsaw owners made quick work of clearing the fallen timber, and electricity network operators from Wales heroically restored power to numerous properties in the area.

However, an on-going casualty in the wake of the storm is Bowhill House and Grounds who, mindful that trees can beome weakened and dangerous to the public following such an intense storn recently issued the following notice on their Facebook page:

"Following Storm Eowyn, we are working hard to assess and clear the damage caused. For everyone's safety, we

> kindly ask you to AVOID all woodlands and walking trails across the Grounds, as our teams focus on clearing the areas."

This was updated two days ago: "We are continuing to clear up after Storm Eowyn but if you are looking for a walk at Bowhill you can now enjoy spotting snowdrops on the tarmac Lochs Road down and around the Lower Loch. (Please note the path around the Upper Loch remains closed)."




