Sadly five red squirrels have been reported killed on the valley roads over the last month alone. 
slow-down-red-squirrel-sign and displaying it on the roadside near your home in Ettrick or Yarrow.

Central Borders Red Squirrel Network was formed in 2023 and is a charity dedicated to stopping the decline of red squirrel populations in the Scottish Borders, to contain or significantly slow the progress of squirrelpox in South Scotland and to improve conditions for viable red squirrel populations across Scotland.

It is a partnership project between the Scottish Wildlife Trust, Nature Scot (formerly Scottish Natural Heritage), Forestry & Land Scotland, Scottish Land and Estates, Red Squirrels forum for South Scotland, Red Squirrel Survival Trust and RSPB Scotland.

cottish Power Energy Networks Scottish Power Energy Networks (SPEN) continues to develop their plans for the pylon route across the Ettrick and Yarrow valleys and down to the Scottish/English border. The route, if agreed, will run from

a new substation at Gala North to

somewhere near Newcastleton.

SPEN has now published the so-called Proposed Route. Those people who commented on the previous route selections in May 2025 and in December 2024 should have received a note (by email or post) with details of how to find the documents with latest information. For all those interested in seeing the impact on the Yarrow and Ettrick Valleys, go to the SPEN website using the following link https://tinyurl. com/4ta5tv3c which will lead vou directly to the Cross Border Connection tab of the 'Investment & Innovation' section.

The report is in the Project Documents tab and Figure 6 seems to be the key section with maps of the proposed route. You can ask for copies of the maps in a larger more legible scale.

Ettrick and Yarrow Community

Development Company (EYCDC) is a member organisation that started with a steering group in 2011 made up of volunteers from all parts of the two valleys and with the help of the community council and the Southern Upland Partnership. It registered as a company limited by quarantee in 2013 and became a charity a few years later.

Since then it has been delivering projects and actions identified by the community through the development plan that was drawn up in 2013 by Julie Nock as a result of a household survey and a lot of village hall meetings. The most notable achievements have been taking ownership and restoring the paths in the Ettrick Marshes and providing five affordable houses to rent at Kirkhope Steading along with the business units.



as well as a new Community Development Plan.

Another not-for-profit company called Community Enterprise has been appointed to do the legwork and produce the finished document.

'Place Plans' are now required documents and can run to over 60 pages! EYCDC and the community council will be working with Community Enterprise over the next few weeks to plan the household survey with the aim of reaching every household in the valleys. They're looking forward to hearing lots of great ideas!



Brrr! Time to wrap up warm!

t's that time of the year when household heating goes up and the savings pot goes down. We all have to be canny with our coins! And there are some avenues of financial help you can try before your funds run low.

If you were born before 21st September 1959 you might be eligible for the Scottish Pension Age Winter Heating Payment. This varies between £100 to £300 depending on who you live with and how old you are. Those born before 21st September 1945 will get the higher rate. In most cases this will be paid automatically and you will receive a letter this month with the payment going into the same bank account as your state pension. The payment will have the reference PAWHP which stands for Pension Age Winter Heating Payment.

Worth Checking!

Pension Credit gives you extra money to help with living costs if



you are over State Pension age and on a low income. It is separate from your State Pension. You can get it even if you have other income, savings or own your own home and it can make you eligible for other benefits as well.

It is estimated that £3.6 million is unclaimed in pension credit in the Borders so it is worth checking if you or your friends are eligible. You can get more information by calling **300 100 1800** or looking at www.scotborders.gov.uk/olderpeoplesupport.
