2 Corinthians 5:19 NLT For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation.

I'm writing this Christmas newsletter the week before Thanksgiving. As I write, I realize there is a strong possibility that I may preach on the subject of this newsletter sometime in December.

I want to start by asking you a question. If you had to sum up Christmas in one word, what would that word be? I'm speculating that the great majority of you would say Jesus. He is the person we love, worship, and proclaim. However, I want to summarize it in a single word that is a verb, an action. That word is **RECONCILIATION.** That is why Jesus came, that we might be reconciled to the Father.

The fact that there needed to be reconciliation means there had been offense that caused separation. Usually when there has been offense, and therefore separation, it is the offending person who needs to make the effort to fix the relationship. This is why the gospel is so incredible, it was the offended one, the perfect one, the holy one, the Lord God Almighty who made the way that the offender, the unperfect one, and the sinful one could be reconciled to Him. For me the message of Christmas, of the gospel, of the cross, can be summarized in the single word **RECONCILIATION**.

As we move towards Christmas, I encourage you to think on these things about reconciliation:

- Because of God's love for us He wants us to be reconciled to Himself and He paid an indescribable price to make it happen.
- We are never more godlike than when we make the first move, and pay the price, to be reconciled with others; regardless of who we think is at fault.
- God has called us to be ambassadors who work to reconcile others to Him.
- Each of us needs to be reconciled to God.

Hopefully at this season you are thinking about what you can give to Jesus. Let me offer some suggestions.

- 1. If you aren't saved, give your life to Christ. He came seeking you. There is great joy in heaven when a person comes to the Lord.
- 2. Commit to sharing the good news of reconciliation with others.
- 3. If your relationship with someone is broken, consider the great price paid to reconcile you. God made us all for relationships. Humble yourself to do all you can to be reconciled with that person, out of appreciation for what God has done for you.

Joy to the world

At this special season, I pray that you will experience the genuine peace that comes with reconciliation; first with God and then with others.
