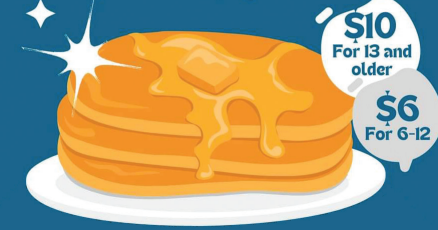

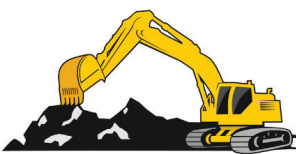

Lavender Oil

Materials:

- Dried Lavender
- Mineral or Olive Oil (enough to cover lavender in oil)
- Large Jar
- Large Bottle
- Cheesecloth or muslin

To make:

Clean out your jar and dry it, then place your dried lavender into the jar. Pour your oil over the lavender until it is covered completely. Place your jar in a window sill that will see a good amount of sun; it will sit there for the next 3-6 weeks. The sun over the next month or so is what will release the parts of the lavender plant that will infuse the oil. Once you've decided the oil has sat there long enough, pour it through your cheesecloth into your last bottle.

Hyacinths

Sunlight and Watering:

Water them only if rainfall is scarce. Too much moisture is death for hyacinths. Full to part sun (4+ hours a day)

Planting:

Plant hyacinth bulbs at least 4 inches below the surface and 3 inches apart. Grape hyacinth bulbs should be planted 2 to 3 inches deep. Pro Tip: Plant hyacinth bulbs in masses to maximize their sweet scent. Set the bulb in the hole pointy end up. Fertilize planting to help them get established and grow strong new roots.

When to Plant:

Planted hyacinths do best when done in the late summer and early fall to establish roots first but potted plants can be done in the Spring.

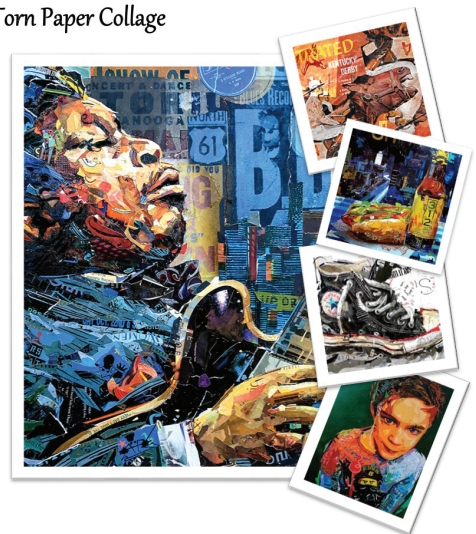

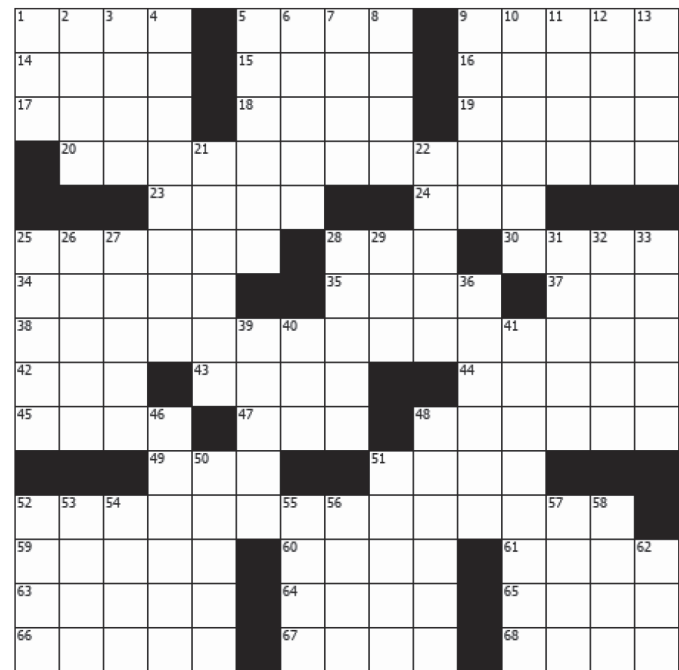

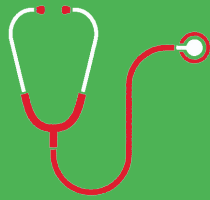

Ingredients:

- Crust and Crumbles:**
 1 cup all-purpose flour
 1 cup & 1/3 cup rolled oats
 3/4 cup granulated sugar
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1/4 teaspoon salt (optional)
 2/3 cup unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- Peach Filling:**
 2 cups peaches, peeled and cut into small pieces
 2 tablespoons sugar
 2 teaspoons cornstarch
 1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
 1 teaspoon almond extract

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease 8 inch square oven-proof dish and line the bottom and sides with parchment paper, about 2 inches of overhang on each side.

Chop the peaches into almost 1/2-1 inch pieces. First, mix the peaches with lemon juice and then with the almond extract. Next, toss with cornstarch and sugar. Set aside.

Mix the flour, rolled oats, sugar, cinnamon, salt well in a medium bowl. Then add the melted butter and stir with a spoon or spatula. Place 2/3 of the mixture into an oven-proof dish that is lined with parchment paper. Use your hands or a spoon to spread the mixture evenly.

Next, cover the crust with the peach mixture but leave the excess liquid in the bowl. You may want to use this liquid later if there is too much left. Sprinkle the remaining dough over the peaches. If you like you can make some big crumble pieces by squeezing crumble mixture in your hand before sprinkling.

Bake for 33-35 minutes until the top becomes golden brown and the crumbles are crunchy. Let it cool at room temperature for almost 1 hour.

Then keep in the fridge for extra 1.5 hours until it is completely cool so you can have nicely cut bars.

CHEESY RANCH CHICKEN PASTA

Ingredients:

- 2 cups shredded chicken, cooked
- 1 package (1 ounce) dry ranch seasoning mix*
- 8 oz. penne noodles, uncooked
- 3½ cups chicken broth
- 4 ounces cream cheese, room temperature
- 4 slices thick-cut bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 2 cups chedd. cheese, shredded
- 1 tbsp. fresh parsley, chopped

Directions:

In a small bowl combine shredded chicken and dry ranch seasoning. (This is your chicken mixture.)

To a large Dutch oven over medium heat, add the chicken broth, penne, and chicken mixture. Stir to combine and then bring to a boil.

Reduce heat to low and then cover and cook for about 15 to 20 minutes or until the pasta is cooked to your preference.

There should still be some liquid in the pot when the pasta is done cooking.

Add the cream cheese to the dutch oven and stir until most of the cream cheese has melted. Add the bacon and shredded cheddar cheese.

Stir everything until cheese is fully melted.

Garnish with parsley and serve.

**MAKE YOUR GARDEN COUNT FOR
BUTTERFLIES**

(NAPSI)—In this season of social distancing, many Amer-
icans are turning to gardening, finding joy and peace
in an outdoor activity that can be safely enjoyed from
home. "What all gardeners know, and the rest of you
may discover, is that if you have even the smallest space,
a pot on a window ledge, a front step, a wee yard, there
is no balm to the soul greater than planting seeds," re-
cently wrote Charlotte Mendelsen for The New Yorker.
If you haven't gotten your hands a little dirty yet, now
could be the time.

More Milkweed for Monarchs

This spring, you can help feed both your soul and but-
terflies across the country by planting monarch habitat,
including milkweed and other flowers that provide nec-
tar. Milkweed in particular provides an essential source
of food and is the only place monarch butterflies will lay
their eggs.

Supporting monarchs is critical, as they face many
health challenges including climate change, drought
and habitat loss. However, anyone can help by planting
milkweed and other brightly colored, pollinator-attrac-
tant flowers in the garden or even on the balcony. There
are 12 states that monarchs tend to visit during their
annual migration. Those who live there can do their part
by planting milkweed and recording their efforts in the
HabiTally app. These states are: **Illinois, Indiana, Iowa,
Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska,
Oklahoma, Ohio, Texas, and Wisconsin.**

Until May 31, any monarch habitat planted in these
states and recorded in the app will be taken into con-
sideration by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service
(USFWS) as it evaluates recommending that monarchs
join the list of animals protected under the Endangered
Species Act. With the help of your conservation efforts,
monarch health may become secure enough to not
need this designation.

Other Flowers That Butterflies Love

For people who don't live in one of those 12 states, there
are many other flowers they can plant to support butter-
flies, bees and other pollinators' health while adding
beauty to the garden with bright, happy blooms. These
10 plants attract butterflies and make vibrant, fragrant
additions to any garden:

- Sunflowers
- Lavender
- Asters
- Coneflowers
- Black-eyed Susans
- Verbena
- Catnip
- Rosemary
- Sage
- Salvia

Whether you already find solace in gardening or are
looking for a new hobby, you can help make a differ-
ence. So, plant a few flowers to see what gardening can
do for you—and for butterflies—this spring.
