#### **Notice of Rate Increase** Water Customers of the Fall River Municipal Water Utility

This is to give you notice that the Fall River Municipal Water Utility will file an application on October 23, 2024, with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC), for authority to increase water rates. Rates for general service will increase 4.1 percent. The increase is necessary to reduce the existing deficiency in present rates. The request is being made under Wis. Stat. 196.193. Rate increases granted under this statute do not require a public hearing. The effect of the increase for some selected customers is shown below. Public Fire Protection and Wholesale rates (if applicable) will also increase 4.1 percent.

#### **Fun for Halloween**

CRAYOLA WINDOWS. Draw pumpkins, witches, goblins on paper. On the reverse side, wipe or rub the entire surface with any available household oil-salad oil, linseed oil, baby oil. Tape sheet with design to inside of window pane. Put lights behind it and it will glow like a stained glass window.



CRAYOLA "SCARE FACES". Have children color a face on a paper bag. Then stuff with newspaper and fasten to stick with string or tape. Paste strings to the head for witch's hair, or add decorated paper cups for hats.

AYOLA GHOSTS. Use white CRAYOLA Wax Crayon to draw ghostly figure on white paper. Then brush paper with diluted tempera paint, ink or water color. 

#### **Ingredients:**

1 package (18.7 oz) Mint Creme Oreo Cookies (family-size) 1 box (3.3 oz) white chocolate instant pudding mix 2 cups milk 6-8 drops green gel food coloring 8 ounces Cool Whip thawed 12 large candy eyeballs 12 small candy eyeballs Hallowwen mix sprinkles

#### **Directions:**

Gently twist one side off of 12 Oreo cookies. Make sure that the filling remains intact on one side. Set the 12 cookie sides with the exposed filling off to the side.

Crush the remaining Oreo cookies (plus the other halves from when you separated them, reserve the half with filling on it for later) into fine dirt-like pieces and set them aside for later.

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together the instant pudding mix, milk, and green food dye for 1-2 minutes until it starts to thicken. Let the pudding sit for 5 minutes to thicken even more.

Stir in the Cool Whip until thoroughly combined.

#### **ASSEMBLE**:

Sprinkle about 2 tablespoons of the cookie crumbs into the bottom of each cup. Add a layer of pudding.

Continue creating layers of crushed cookies and pudding. making sure to end with a cookie layer on top.

Chill the pudding cups (covered) for 1 hour to set and thicken.

When ready to serve, press eyeballs on exposed Oreo filling and put in each cup.


#### HALLOWEEN MOVIE FACT!



#### **Ingredients**:

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 375 degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Cut crescent roll dough into 8 rectangles. Place each on the sheet. Spread pizza sauce over the top of each and leave edges clean. Top with pepperoni and shredded mozzarella. Unroll the other sheet and cut it into 8 similar rectangles then into strips to make the mummy's bandages. Arrange and press in place.

Brush melted butter and top with garlic powder. Place two black olive eyes on top of each pizza pocket.

Bake in the preheated oven for 12 to 15 minutes, until the crust is golden brown and the cheese is melted.






#### **Ingredients**:

2 cups dry roasted peanuts 1 bag Peanut Butter Chips 4 Tbsp. butter 14 oz. sw. condensed milk 1 ½ cups candy corn 10 oz. mini marshmallows

#### **Directions:**

Fill the bottom of a 9 x 13" baking pan with 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  cups of peanuts and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of candy corn.

Spread out peanuts and candy corn until evenly distributed.

In a small saucepan melt 1 bag of peanut butter chips and 4 TB butter, stirring until smooth. Remove from heat.

Add sweetened condensed milk to saucepan with melted peanut butter chips and stir until well combined.

Add mini marshmallows to a large mixing bowl; pour melted peanut butter mixture over the marshmallows and stir.

Spread peanut butter marshmallow mixture this over the top of the nuts and candy corn in the pan.

Sprinkle the rest of the peanuts and candy corn on top and gently press into the bars.

Refrigerate at least an hour to set.
