

## **Title: Purposeful Living: Understanding Your Role as a Believer**

Introduction: As believers, understanding our purpose is crucial to living a fulfilled and impactful life. This Bible study aims to explore the biblical foundations for the purpose of a believer and how our identity in Christ shapes our roles and responsibilities in this world.

3. Consider 2 Corinthians 5:18-20. How are believers called to be ambassadors for Christ?

### **Session 4: Salt and Light in the World Scripture: Matthew 5:13-16; Philippians 2:14-15; 1 Peter 2:9**

Discussion Points:

1. Reflect on Matthew 5:13-16. In what ways are believers described as salt and light in the world?
2. Explore Philippians 2:14-15. How can believers shine as lights in a crooked and twisted generation?
3. Consider 1 Peter 2:9. What is the significance of being a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and God's special possession?

### **Session 5: Serving Others in Love Scripture: Galatians 5:13; James 2:14-17; 1 John 3:16-18**

Discussion Points:

1. Reflect on Galatians 5:13. How does freedom in Christ lead to serving others?
2. Explore James 2:14-17. How does faith without works affect our purpose as believers?
3. Consider 1 John 3:16-18. In what ways can believers practically demonstrate love through actions?

**Conclusion:** As believers, our purpose is rooted in our relationship with God, our identity as image-bearers of Christ, the Great Commission, being salt and light in the world, and serving others in love.
