Farmers & Artisans Market

Established in 2011

The Certified Orange Home Grown Farmers and Artisans Market sources farms from the Southern California region that hold a California Certified Producers Certificate (CPC), keeping produce local and fresh. Food Artisans found at the market sell items such as breads, cheeses, oils, and dips that are made using traditional methods, increasing the diversity of goods and foods found at the market and the chance to share in someone else's food culture. The local craft artisans section at the market provides handmade goods like soap, pottery, clothing, and jewelry to the community.

Activities at the market include: live music, pet sitting, kid's club, cooking demos, yoga, educational classes, a food trunk rotation, market tours, and more.

Seed Lending Library

Established in 2016

The Orange Seed Lending Library is a free self-serve system located at the Orange Public Library, the Taft Library, the El Modena Branch Library in the city of Orange, and once a month at the Farmers Market. Community members are invited to borrow seeds for their garden. Since seeds are a living thing, they must be renewed each year by someone, or unique varieties can become extinct. Growing just one seed and returning it to the library is a valuable contribution to the future.

Youth Food Literacy Program

Established in 2017

The Youth Food Literacy Program is a nine month course where high school students engage in the entire food production cycle, from seed to dinner table and beyond. This course gives them the tools to make powerful choices related to food, their health, and their future, and offers opportunities for potential job experience after program end. Since 2017, scholarships have also been provided to each student who completes the program.
