



### Patron Story

Bill had gone thru a very difficult situation a few years ago. His life was not what he wanted or envisioned and getting to an improved situation was going to be very difficult. He set a plan that involved steady employment and he achieved that. Even so, with the way prices have increased in the past 5 years, he still wasn't always making ends meet. **To supplement the need, he turned to North Dearborn Pantry.** At first, it was on a frequent basis. As time went on and he further improved his situation, the need became less. He now rarely comes to the pantry for assistance. The tears in his eyes turned into a soft whimper as he relayed where he had been and where he is now. He expressed his appreciation for North Dearborn Pantry as a key element to being able to improve his situation and his overall life. He continued that **without the pantry, he's not sure he would have made it.** He tells his story to anyone who will listen and encourages them to be brave enough to ask for help.



Have you met Bob Waples? If you live in northern Dearborn County the answer is likely, “yes”.




## Highlights
