

COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

September 24, 2018

The Jewell County Commissioners met September 24, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. Commissioners, Keith Roe, Steve Greene and Mark Fleming were present. Carla J Waugh, County Clerk, was present for the meeting.

The following were present for office head meeting: Don Jacobs, Sheriff; Chris Petet, Custodian; Joel Elkins, General Superintendent; Nancy Marihugh, Health Nurse; Anna Morgan, Register of Deeds and Gail Bartley, Noxious Weed Director, Emergency Preparedness Director and 911 Coordinator. Those absent: Shannon Meier, Ambulance Director; Anna Porter, County Appraiser; Barrett Simon, Livestock Agent; Travis Garst, Solid Waste Director; Brenda Eakins, Treasurer.

Don Jacobs advised that two new employees are starting this week. He said that on October 13th during the Corn Show they will once again have "Touch a Truck" for the children to explore the vehicles. The car seat inspection station will also be at the Corn Show.

Nancy Marihugh said they completed hearing and vision checks at school and will be going back for some rechecks. They will be providing a Flu Shot clinic at the school as well as at the Corn Show. Nancy said flu shots are available for County Employees. She reported providing forty flu shots to date.

Anna Morgan said that Amanda Davis, Deputy Register of Deeds, attended the Register of Deeds Annual meeting and the association discussed changes in fees.

Gail Bartley said he is scheduled to attend the Homeland Security meeting in Beloit tomorrow. He reported on follow up meeting with State Emergency Management Personnel, Shannon Meier and Don Jacobs.

Joel Elkins said his department is working on dirt roads and a bridge project. They will start back on road projects soon.

Chris Petet said he received another quote for the windows in the Sheriff's Dispatch Office.

Carla J. Waugh said her office has been working on adding the Kansas Bostwick Irrigation District special assessment to the tax roll. She said the office has also been working on real estate changes. Carla said they have received the ballot proofs for the November 6th Election. She said that two legal notices have been published for the November Election (the registration deadline being October 16th and the candidate listing). Carla said they continue to work on the open records request from Nationwide. She reported on the North Central Kansas County Clerk's District meeting she attended last week in Concordia.

Mark Fleming said he attended the Food Council meeting, Hospital Revenue Bond Public Hearing and Multi County meeting.

Steve Greene said he attended the Hospital Revenue Bond Public Hearing and Multi County meeting. Steve also attended the Economic Development meeting and plans to attend the Hospital Board meeting this week.

Keith Roe attended the NCRPC meeting. He said the voter registration deadline of October 16th is important because many people have not updated their address. This concludes office head meeting.

Gail Bartley discussed the disaster declaration and resolution 18-06 from September 4th.

Don Jacobs, Sheriff, purchased active shooter trauma kits for his department.

The minutes of the September 17, 2018 County Commissioners meeting were approved.

Steve Greene moved and Mark Fleming seconded to sign the letter of support to Kansas Department of Transportation for Solomon Valley Transportation in the amount of \$16,000. Motion passed unanimously.

The Commissioners reviewed the quotes previously received along with one additional quote of \$12,920.72 for three windows with sliders. Mark Fleming moved and Steve Greene seconded to approve the quote from Jackson's Glass Shop for three new windows for a total of \$12,920.72. Motion passed unanimously.

Joel Elkins, General Superintendent, discussed the 2019 bridge inspection for the Fracture Critical Bridges. The Commissioners discussed funding for the expenditures of the 21 miles of asphalt in Jewell County. For calendar year 2018, Jewell County has already spent \$70,000 for cold mix and \$15,000 for road oil on the maintenance for the twenty-one asphalt miles in Jewell County. Joel Elkins said for the future we need to consider overlay on some of the asphalt roads.

Casey Frasier, Foley Equipment, invited the Commissioners to a customer appreciation meal on October 8th.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 a.m.
