Garden Update

 - Not buying more tools until the garden shed is secure

Project Cornerstone

- PC is partnering with teachers during Serve-a-Thon week to paint the buddy benches

Principal Update

- Pick up and drop off are hard but overall going well
- Kids are doing a good job of distancing during lunch with gentle reminders
- Considering a sunshade over outdoor amphitheater to have more usable outdoor space, parent request
- Lisa will partner with a program for art to have an art docent who provides 12 weeks of art instruction, it's called Arts for Kids
- Graduation, we have permission to hold a live graduation, it will be livestreamed so all students on campus and parents at home can see it
 - Car parade may also be another way to involve parents
 - Steindorf got permission to hold a live event event but Price's is virtual
- Science Camp for this year's 5th graders cannot happen because there are not spots even for next year's 5th graders, much less 6th graders

Proposed 2021-2022 Budget

- HSC Board is presenting a draft budget
- Tier 1 budget is what we have been using during pandemic
- \$70K is the average incoming from Giving Campaign over the past four years
- We just received a matching plus donor check of \$25K
- We have some significant expenses, including the new art program
 - That is why many numbers are so much higher than usual
- Parent feedback about Charleston Wrap conflicted so we will provide Boon Supply and Charleston Wrap as passive fundraisers
- Parent feedback was that they love auctions
 - Even when at a different school site there was no food and they had an auction in the school, they were able to bring in substantial fundraising dollars
 - Even if it is bare-bones it can be a big money maker as you are absent the venue fee
 - Feedback during the meeting is the Historical Club venue is preferred by many
- New Opportunities encompasses Boo Gram type events and has a fundraising goal of \$3K
 - Flexibility in terms of exactly what the events are
 - Hosting a Steindorf flea market for the community -- food trucks and there are ways to do fundraisers we have not done before
 - Instead of a fall festival, maybe we have a fall haunted house
 - Fall haunted house, not festival because we do not know how to plan when parents are not now allowed on campus
- Liz Warren has offered to oversee the full play production for 2022 -- thank you Liz!
- In the budget, Music is evolving -- Mr. Derek would like to offer a garage band elective

- Professional development is going up from this year because there was not much offered during pandemic and we want to focus for teachers to stay invigorated with PBL -- PBL training is pricey
- Lisa is sharing her principal budget for the meeting to see
