SPRINGFIELD CLARK COUNTY USBC YOUTH MASTERS TOURNAMENT RULES

1. This tournament is open to all Springfield Clark County USBC youth league bowlers and Clark County high school bowlers from ages 13 up to 18 and in school. If no USBC membership, high school bowlers may purchase a USBC membership for \$4.00
2. This is a handicap tournament based on 90% of 220 average.
3. Each certified league youth bowler will use his/her final average for the 2024-2025 season, minimum of 12 games, or high school average, minimum of 12 games, whichever is higher. High school bowlers who are not USBC members will use their high school average for the 2024-2025 season, a minimum of 12 games, as found on their league conference website. If no 2024-2025 high school average, bowler may use the 2025-2026 high school average, minimum of 12 games. If no verified average is available, the bowler's average will be established after the first 3 games bowled in the tournament.
4. All entrants will bowl 5 qualifying games moving to the next pair after each game. The field will then be cut to the top 25%, 5 bowlers maximum. Those qualifiers will bowl in the step ladder finals to determine the winner of the tournament.
5. Tiebreakers:
6.
 - a. In the event of a tie going into the qualifying round, the bowler with the highest game in the qualifier will take the higher position. If still tied, the next highest game will count and so on until the tie is broken.
 - b. If the tie is still not broken by the highest qualifying games, position will be decided by a 9th/10th frame roll-off
7. In the event of a tie in the stepladder finals, the bowlers will bowl a one game roll-off to determine who advances.
8. **Dress code requirements: Dress slacks or jeans, no sweatpants. Jeans and slacks must be neat and free of rips and tears. No t-shirts, hats, muscle shirts, short shorts, short skirts, short skorts, cut off shirts or halter tops, spandex or other apparel or equipment advertising or referencing alcohol or tobacco products or socially unacceptable language or phrase will be allowed. ALL PANTS MUST BE WORN AT THE WAIST – NO EXCEPTIONS. Branded bowling shirts and high school jerseys are acceptable. DRESS CODE WILL BE ENFORCED!**
9. Please turn off all electronic devices during the tournament. No earbuds.
10. Unsportsmanlike conduct as determined by the tournament committee may result in disqualification.
11. Awards will be in the form of scholarships. All monies will be placed in an account administered by SMART for youth bowlers.
12. USBC Youth Division rules and regulations will govern this tournament.
13. Lane Conditions: The Springfield Clark County Youth Masters will be conducted on lane conditions similar to an approved USBC challenge shot.
14. The Springfield Clark County USBC is not responsible for any lane conditioning equipment malfunction or equipment breakdowns. The tournament manager and/or tournament committee will make the final decision regarding any issues that may arise during the tournament. .
15. The Springfield Clark County USBC will not be responsible for any injuries or illnesses resulting from the entrant bowling in this tournament.
16. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED ON CONCOURSE DURING YOUTH TOURNAMENT. ALCOHOL ONLY ALLOWED IN BAR. In the event an adult tournament is scheduled at the same time, ONLY bowlers in the adult tournament can have alcoholic beverages on their lanes.**
