Use with "All I Want for Christmas" Pattern


Crabby

This applique will need to be positioned before putting the final blocks of your wreath together. Read all instructions before beginning.



Trace Crabby's head onto fusible web and fuse to the wrong side of your choice of fabric. Cut out carefully on the lines. Remove the back of the fusible web and center his head on the bottom edge of center Block A of the wreath, prior to stitching it to Block C (bow block). Fuse in place with an iron. Applique using your desired method.

Applique Claws Option: trace two of the applique claws onto fusible web and fuse to fabric. Cut out and position as you choose near Crabby's head (see sample photos on our website for ideas).



Stuffed Claws Option: (All seams are sewn at ¼ inch)

Fold red fabric with right sides together, cut (4) claw pieces. Sew (2) claw pieces together with right sides together, and leaving open as indicated. Repeat with other 2 claw pieces. Clip curves and corners. Turn claws right side out and poke out the tips. Stuff lightly with polyfil. Position each claw under the edge of Crabby's head on the right and left side before appliqueing it in place. When you run the applique stitch of your choice around the head, be sure to catch the opening of each claw in the stitching to secure it in place.

Add buttons or beads sewn in the center of Crabby's eye bumps to give him even more personality.

Continue the instructions in the "All I Want for Christmas" pattern to assemble your wall-hanging. NOTE: the applique shapes can also be used on the table runner and pillow included in this pattern.
