

DIY Scrunchies

Yardage:

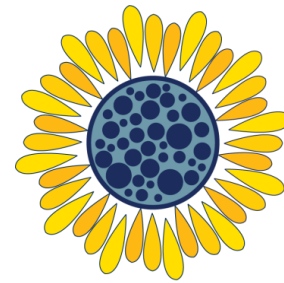
Scrunchie fabric: 1/8 yard (makes 2)

1/4 inch elastic: 8 inches (makes 1) can be purchased by the yard or in packages

Notions: Safety Pin

Cutting Instructions:

Using a rotary cutter, cut fabric into 4 inch x 20 inch rectangles. Cut elastic into 8 inch pieces.

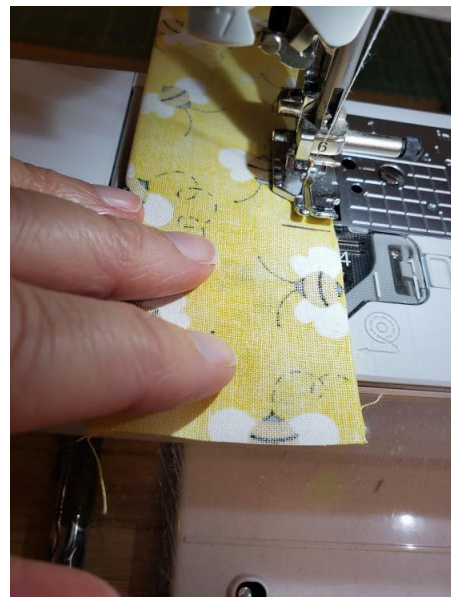


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2. Using 1/4 inch seam, stitch along raw edge between your marks.



1. Fold fabric in half along 20 inch side and press. Mark raw edges at 2 inches from each end.



3. You will end up with a tube. Turn the tube so that the fabric is right side out. Press.



4. With Right sides together, pin open ends.



7. Attach a safety pin to one end of the elastic. Feed the Pin and Elastic thru the fabric tube.



5. Using ¼ inch seam, stitch ends together.



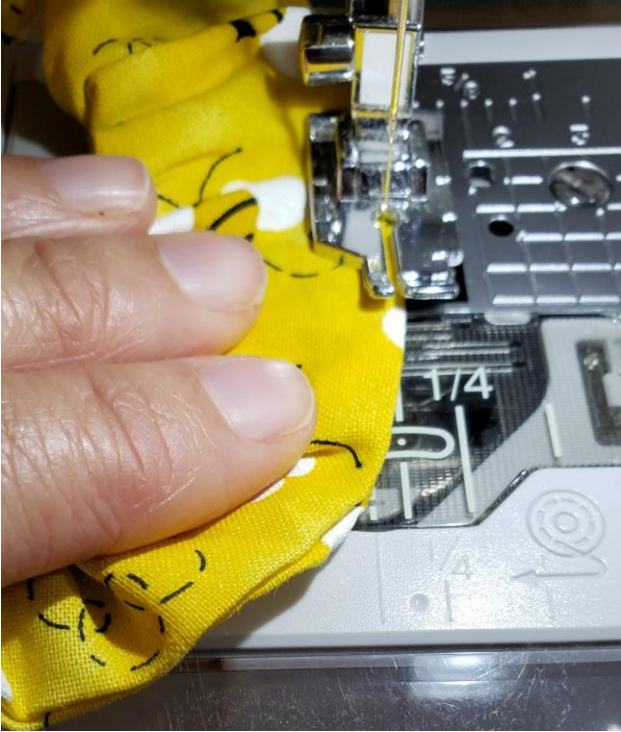
8. Overlap the elastic ends about 1 inch. Stitch thru both layers of elastic 2-3 times. (I run it thru forward, then reverse stitch, then forward again)



6. Turn raw edges to inside and press.



9. Using coordinating thread, stitch opening closed.



10. Your scrunchie is ready to wear! Now you can make dozens!



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
