Ezekiel 37:1-6 (MSG) (The Valley of Dry Bones)

"God grabbed me. God's Spirit took me up and set me down in the middle of an open plain strewn with bones. He led me around and among them-a lot of bones! There were bones all over the plain-dry bones, bleached by the sun. He said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?"

I said, "Master God, only you know that."

He said to me, "Prophesy over these bones: 'Dry bones, listen to the Message of God!'"

God, the Master, told the dry bones, "Watch this: I'm bringing the breath of life to you and you'll come to life. I'll attach sinews to you, put meat on your bones, cover you with skin, and breathe life into you. You'll come alive and you'll realize that I am God!"

As we enter 2025, most of us are focused on our New Year's resolutions, perhaps it's getting healthier by moving more, saving money, moving up in our job/career, expanding our education, and many other goals.

What about your spiritual resolutions? Our relationship with God should be a prioritized because it will guarantee us more meaningful lives, allowing us to experience deeper joy, love, hope, and peace.

Last year I learned about "star words" or "star gifts." This is a prayer practice that is connected to Epiphany and is meant to guide us in our faith journey throughout the year. And so, on Sunday, January 6<sup>th</sup>, during communion, individuals will be instructed to pick up a star word that is placed faced down on tables. Each word is different, and individuals do not choose their own word, but instead trust the Holy Spirit is guiding them to the word God wants them to have. The word is placed somewhere that will be seen on a regular basis and throughout the year, the individual will consistently reflect on how God is moving through, around, or in connection to the word in our lives. These words will invite us to practice a new prayer rhythm of reflection and review that can be a powerful way to connect with God.

For those who cannot be present at the January 6<sup>th</sup> service, but still want to a "star word" for 2025, please go to this link <a href="https://wheelofnames.com/y6g-9wt">https://wheelofnames.com/y6g-9wt</a> and click on the wheel and it will give you your "star word" which can then be written on a paper star and placed somewhere you see it on a regular basis so you can meditate on how God is speaking to you through the word. Also, we MAY have some extra "star words" available after the service and if so, please come to the office and you can draw one randomly from a basket.

My "star word" for 2025 is generosity. I will be honest, at first, I did not like my word and thought about clicking the wheel again to get another one, but after praying about my word, I realized this is exactly the word God meant for me to have. There are many times when not only do I need to be more generous to others, but also, generous to myself.

And so, friends, I encourage you to participate in the "star word" challenge and experience what God is telling you through this word. In a year, it will be interesting to look back and see just how God used our "star words" to speak to us and draw us closer.
