The Sunday School Teachers at First United Methodist Church await you with great excitement as we begin to move closer to our Opening Celebration for the start of Sunday School. In these unprecedented times, it is of great importance to study God's Word and surround ourselves with Christ-minded people to prepare ourselves to go out into a world that does not know Him so that we may spread the good news!

Our Sunday School classes will begin with an Opening Celebration on September 20th, at 9:00 a.m. Please enter the building on the lower level from the West Side of the building (6th Street Side) and go into the Fellowship Hall to your teacher's table to register for this year. Tables will be clearly marked for you. **Parents/legal guardians must be present to fill out the registration sheet and give updated emergency contact information**. After you fill out your form, the students and families can take a seat and join us for a light breakfast, fellowship, teacher presentations (Julie Wolfe will also be there to talk about Youth Group as well) and worship as we pray for our students and teachers in this upcoming year.

Due to COVID-19 virus concerns, we are encouraging students wear masks upon entering the building, and once seated in their room they may remove it if they wish, or they may keep it on if it makes them more comfortable. Our teachers have been preparing their classrooms to keep their students socially distanced and hand sanitizer will be available upon entering the church. We ask that you carefully monitor your students and if they are not feeling well, that you please keep them at home. Temperatures will be taken when students enter the building beginning on Sunday, September 27th.
