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But the reality is that most churches never take the time to clearly define what their core values are. When Core Values are "muddy" or "inarticulate" here's what often happens to a church:

Ambiguous Core Values Results

- Poor planning
- Low morale
- Broken relationships
- Decision-making is timid and very slow
- Preoccupation with trivial matters
- Constant squabbling over matters of personal taste
- Decisions constantly deferred
- So-called "traditions" keep churches from moving forward

Clear, Articulated Core Values

- Higher morale
- Ability to plan the future
- Quick resolution of disputes
- Healthier relationships
- Focus on "Big Picture" items
- Rapid Decision-making
- Easier entrance for new members
