Sir Robert Cohan CBE (1925-2021) was one of the true pioneers of modern and contemporary dance. Born in New York, Cohan joined the Martha Graham Dance Company in 1947 and moved to London in 1968 to assume the role of founding Artistic Director of The Place and London Contemporary Dance Theatre. His impact on the dance world in the UK and Europe was immediate and profound. Throughout his seven decades-long career Cohan helped to shape and reshape the artform in the UK and abroad. Tonight's programme represents a small sample of his works integrated with archival footage providing a window into Cohan's creative process, philosophy, life and humour.

The **Sir Robert Cohan Dance Legacy CIC** is a newly formed organisation registered with Companies House as a not-for-profit Community Interest Company (#14526759). The RCDL mission is to support production of Cohan's choreographic works and research into his works, teaching, and professional life. The RCDL is committed to sponsoring and supporting educational seminars and projects related to Cohan's legacy, as well as the development of new artists and researchers seeking to expand upon that legacy.
