Requesting Org: The General and Mrs. Curtis E. LeMay Foundation

Requested Amount: \$500

Details: We are not asking to fund an event. Our assistance is given for as long as it's needed. We are currently assisting 3 spouses in TX. Mrs. Jacinta is the youngest of the ladies at 68 years old. She lives in Jourdanton and has received our supplemental income since 2019. Mrs. Brenda is 80 years old and resides in Bedford. She's been with the foundation since 2005. Mrs. Maureen

is at the young age of 90. She has been with the foundation for two years and has been receiving \$450 per month.

The LeMay Foundation is here to assist the surviving spouses of all Air & Space Force retirees, both enlisted and officers. Our promise has been to help provide financial stability to these surviving spouses to remain in their homes. This supplemental benefit improves their quality of life and covers many essential needs.

Requesting Org: Prop Enterprises LLC dba Bluebonnet Books (to provide books to the children at Sheppard Elementary)

Requested Amount: \$3,936

Details: I am the author of a children's book called "Reach the Magic," which is a fun, heartwarming story about the magic of friendship, kindness, and reading (there is a full readalong video of the book on ReachTheMagicBook.com, if you'd like to see it!). My request is that the Sheppard Spouses Club provide an autographed copy of the book for each child at Sheppard Elementary. This would be an extremely generous gift to these military kids, and I know they would be thrilled. I would also be happy to visit the school and do a free author visit where I read the book to the kids and answer questions about being an author. When I've done these in the past, and an organization is providing free copies to the children afterward, the kids are ecstatic when I tell them the news after we've read and discussed, and then they get their very own, brand-new copy to bring home. It's like a holiday celebration! "Reach the Magic" is sold on Amazon for \$16.95, and through the Bluebonnet Books website for \$15. If the SSC is willing to support this initiative, I would offer a bulk order discount price of \$12 per book. I believe there are about 310 children enrolled at Sheppard Elementary (though the number fluctuates a bit as military families PCS) and 18 core classrooms, so 328 books should be enough for each child to get a book and each classroom to get one, as well (328 books x \$12/book = \$3,936).

When I was in fifth and sixth grade, we had an author visit our school, and he inspired my dream of one day becoming an author. I would love to be able to inspire these awesome military kids that they, too, can follow their dreams.

The book has a heartwarming message about friendship, kindness, accepting others, and embracing literacy. If every child at Sheppard Elementary not only read these words but also got to bring the book home with them, I think there could be an amazing ripple effect. The book is a fun, engaging story that draws the reader in, and it contains a subtle message about getting to know people, giving others a chance, and embracing our differences. The take-aways would be especially relevant for the kids at Sheppard Elementary, who come from all different countries and backgrounds.

I have partnered with several other groups and organizations to provide books to children and schools. The NTX Area United Way has purchased hundreds of books for local schools, and the Rotary Club of Wichita Falls purchased books for Booker T. Washington Elementary. An automotive group sponsored books for Wright Elementary, and Rebecca Lammers Insurance purchased several boxes of books to donate to schools. This would be a wonderful opportunity for the children of Sheppard Elementary School to also benefit from this book, the story's powerful message, and a free author visit.

Details: We would like \$1k to help with our group's children's holiday party. We've raised \$1300 doing fundraisers in each squadron. We've requested donations from each booster club and received \$500 from 362's Booster club. These funds would go towards food, activities, and picture opportunities. We plan to make food for the event ourselves, so the money will go to supplies and activities. We have raised \$3500, we intend to do 2 more fundraisers and we hope to receive donations from the other 2 booster clubs. We are also delivering donation letters monthly to businesses in town. Details: Our team would love to participate in a fall soccer tournament in Dallas (7-8 Dec), which costs a lot, especially now playing a higher age group. We would have 14 kids on the roster, 2 coaches and 1 manager, so for 17 people in total. We have some funds from our fundraiser (325\$ from Jason's Deli), but we request 250\$ if possible, to keep the costs low for our families since they have to book rooms to stay. We need to pay 895\$ tournament fee in total. Some of our families out of the WF community are less fortunate, that's why we are reaching out. We want to make competitive sports accessible to everyone in our community. What the families pay in the beginning of the year, it's just enough to cover their league games, training fees & referee costs. The tournament has a 895\$ entrance fee (https://u90c.com/upper-90-challenge) for our U12 boys. It's also a stay to play tournament, so parents have to stick to the hotel list and have to book a room for the weekend.

We already raised 325\$ with Jason's Deli, we are looking to raise more, but unfortunately not before the tournament due payment date on 10 Nov (fundraiser Applebees on 16Nov).
