Details: I am writing to you on behalf of Wild Bird Rescue, a dedicated organization committed to the care and rehabilitation of injured and orphaned birds. We are seeking your support for our

Volunteer Training Program, an essential initiative that empowers our volunteers with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide the best possible care to the wildlife we serve.

As you may know, several of our dedicated volunteers are military personnel stationed at Sheppard Air Force Base. Their involvement not only enriches our program but also strengthens the bond between the local community and the military. We work collaboratively with these volunteers on various projects throughout the year, fostering teamwork and community engagement.

The funds we are requesting will be utilized to enhance our training program, specifically focusing on the unique needs of endangered species birds. This training will cover essential topics, including avian anatomy, nutrition, proper handling techniques, and rehabilitation practices. By equipping our volunteers with this critical knowledge, we can improve our rescue efforts and ensure higher survival rates for the birds in our care.

Moreover, this program is not just about wildlife conservation; it is also an opportunity for team and strength building within our community. By bringing together local residents and military members, we promote understanding, camaraderie, and shared purpose, which are invaluable in today's world.

We believe that with your generous support, we can expand our training initiatives, ultimately benefiting both the birds we rescue and the volunteers who dedicate their time and effort to this cause. Your contribution will help us create a more informed and effective volunteer team, enhancing the overall impact of Wild Bird Rescue in Wichita Falls.

Requesting Org: Tower Elementary Requested Amount: \$500 Recommendations: \$500

Details: Tower Elementary has the Braveheart Club- which provides peer and military mentor support for students who have a parent gone, or leaves frequently, due to the military. Although this is a training base, we still have some grown ups deploy, quite a few parents go remote, and others TDY frequently or for extended periods. We hold the club every other week in the mornings, to not provide too much added strain to their parent. During the meeting the kids bring their breakfast, and we provide a fun craft and support. We also are hoping to provide at least two field trips this year. We currently have 12 kids registered, but that will change as parents realize the club is an option. Last year we got up to 26 students by the end of the year. Tower also has a Student 2 Student (S2S) club, that is based on the MCEC (Military Child Education Coalition), which follows the MCECs guidance and provides peer support for new students as well as service to others. We host meetings for these students every other week and provide snacks and create welcome bags for the new students that arrive at Tower. This club has around 25 students, and will welcome all new students, whether military or not (although most are military). These funds would help cover the Braveheart Clubs crafts and field trips. They would also be used to support the S2S club and their snacks, possible field trips for community service, and other administrative items. Directly- 50 students, indirectly- new students and the community. We have 2 main fundraising streams, a Family T Shirt (RED) in October, and a Purple Up T-Shirt in April.

Details: We are desperately trying to raise funds for the Holiday Party for our squadron. All funds raised will go to off-set ticket prices for food (\$400), decorations (\$200), location (\$200) and give away for the squadron (\$200). We are a very small squadron (70 people) and have a lot of first term Airmen that do not have a lot so fundraising is very minimal. \$3000 is what we are trying to earn. We have raised \$500 and are planning (3) more fundraisers. Event is 12/13/2024.

Details: The 469th Spouses Group needs to order new farewell gifts for our spouses/families to be presented to them during their FINI flight (final flight with our squadron). These gifts are a thank you to the spouses and family for supporting their active duty member during their time in the 469th, as well as recognizing them for being members of the Fighting Bullettes. We will be ordering 30 new squadron specific ceramic tiles made by Hand-N-Hand Designs. We were quoted around \$375 before tax (estimated 8.5% of total cost) and shipping (estimated 12% of total cost). We do not have funds raised at this moment due to other spouse group purchases/ social expenses we have had. We do have a fundraising table at every UPT graduation selling swag in hopes of raising money. 30 spouses/ families impacted.

Outcome: Discussion held and voting took place - Kelsie moved to give full amount of \$455, Jaclyn B. seconded - voting: 11-yes, 1-abstention - *passes*

Requesting Org: 361 Unit Advisory Council Requested Amount: \$500 Recommendations: \$500 Details: Costs: \$2000 Venue Rental, \$2000 Food, \$200 Drinks, \$150 Decorations, \$500 Childcare, \$4000 Gifts/Raffle Prizes for Holiday Party.

We are currently limited to only allowing 15 children at the venue for childcare during the event. However, we are exploring other options due to the venue limitation. Total Estimate: \$9000 Current Raised: \$7000

We have a Bowl-A-Thon planned for each quarter with the next one being in October to assist in our financial goal for the event. We have completed two Bowl-A-Thons this year that have raised

about \$4000 together and also volunteered at a NASCAR event that raised about \$900. We also have multiple requests for funding from organizations within the squadron periodically throughout the year for events such as babies & bundles, newcomers welcome, promotion ceremonies, and squadron renovations. We also provide funding for change of command ceremonies and leadership PCS celebrations. Event date 12/7/2024 **Outcome:** Discussion held and voting took place - Kelsie moved to give \$500, Sharon seconded - voting: 11-yes, 1-abstention - **passes**

Details: The Memorial High School Booster Club, will be hosting our inaugural fundraiser, *"BINGO WITH THE BULLS,"* on October 10th from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at City of Hope Church in Wichita Falls. The event's proceeds will go toward purchasing team warm-ups, which cost \$1,400.

We kindly request your support to help us cover the total costs for the fundraiser, which include \$200 for 20 XL pizzas, four cases of 36 packs of soda for \$61.92, and five cases of 40 bottles of water for \$21.40. Details: 80th ENJJPT vs 82nd AITs soccer game

On suggestion of the 82nd Training Wing, the question was raised of playing a yearly soccer game between the 80th ENJJPT personnel & the 82nd AITs, to strengthen the relationship and cohesion between the two Wings. It would be a recurring event called the World Cup and the ENJJPT team will consist of a mix of the best available players from all parts of the wing, officers and enlisted, co-ed. The first game will be held on 25 October 2024 at Sheppard AFB. However, a soccer team requires soccer uniforms. The 82nd already has USA themed uniforms, but the ENJJPT Wing does not. The question was raised to the Wing, but there is no budget foreseen; no funds are available for buying 20 uniforms (shorts & jerseys). Also, the organizers had limited time to prepare and weren't able to fundraise at this time. The aim is to keep these uniforms in the 80th FTW for the next years, so they wouldn't be kept personally by the players, but they will be re-used every event. The kit costs 38\$ per player, tax included. There will be 20 players on the roster, so the needed budget is 760\$, tax incl. This roster is 100% military from SAFB. **Outcome**: Discussion held and amendments were suggested. Final vote and outcome was for Amanda moving to give the full requested amount of \$760, Carren seconded - voting: 11-yes, 1-abstention - **passes**

Requesting Org: SAFB Youth Flag Football Requested Amount: \$2000 Recommendations: \$1000

Details: These funds are, in hopes, to help support this Winter's SAFB flag football teams for the NFL Flag Super Regional Tournament at the Dallas Cowboys Ford Center, December 7-8, 2024. This tournament has been around for over 10 years but SAFB has not had the opportunity to partake due to the locations being too far out of the area I.E. New Orleans, Las Vegas, Nashville.

With this year's tournament being in Dallas, this gives these kids from this installation an opportunity that most will never get.

The ask for funds for this tournament is \$1000. SAFB will be able to attend this tournament due to them playing NFL Flag football requirements through the YMCA. SAFB will be assembling two

10 man teams. An 8U division and a 10U division. Each team, per the NFL Flag football guidelines can only roster 10 kids max and are only allowed two coaches per team. So in all, 20 kids/players and 4 Coaches will attend. The entry fee is \$375/team if paid by October 25th. \$750 in all for both teams to enter. After October 25th, the entry fee will go up to \$475/team. We will also have to provide lodging for the teams. And per the NFL Flag football by-laws, they have a "Stay-And-Play" rule to where any team outside of a 75 mile radius of event MUST/Required to stay with a list of hotels (that are teamed with the event) that they provide for each group. The hotels range from \$120-\$200 per night times 20 rooms. Additionally, with lodging and Entry fees, we will have to make sure we have meals for 20 players for two days and the 4 Coaches.

The main ask from the Spouses club is not to cover all of the expenses but to assist in making a small but very crucial dent to make this fantasy a reality for these kids and their families. In all we will need roughly \$3800 for both teams to attend and if your organization can donate \$1000, that will help this process out tremendously. We will also be reaching out to other private orgs and the parents of the players attending will be donating to get to the collective goal as well...
