ZOOM JSUMAC Chapter Meeting Secretary's Report

Chapter Meeting Date: September 18, 2023

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Sylvester Taylor officially called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

<u>Invocation</u> – Richard Taylor provided the opening prayer.

<u>Parliamentary Procedures</u> – William Buchanan reviewed the parliamentary procedures and provided rules to making a motion. The meeting will follow the newly revised Robert's Rules of Order and will last one hour unless a motion is accepted to extend for 15-minute increments. Committee heads are reminded to be mindful of a 2-minute limit.

<u>Roll Call</u> by Assistant Secretary Dr. Renee Slaughter: President – Sylvester Taylor, 1st Vice President – Richard Taylor, 2nd Vice President- Dr. Carlos Sample, Secretary – Amethyst Whitley, Assistant Secretary – Renee Slaughter, Treasurer – open, Financial Secretary – Dylester Scott, Chaplain – Debbie Lowe (excused), Parliamentarian – William Buchanan, Immediate Past President – Deborah Taylor (excused).

<u>Greetings and Welcome Message</u> – President Sylvester Taylor provided opening greetings and provided the Tiger Hot Topic. JSU's enrollment has dropped to less than 7K students at just 6,958. As we go forward, let's brainstorm ways on what we can do to increase enrollment. Volunteer for student recruitment fairs, attend events hosted by the Chapter as any funds raised go towards scholarship, and/or sponsor a student for High School Day 2023. High School Day will be Saturday, November 4. The trip participant max is 40 students. Sponsorships (\$95) are being requested from alumni to cover the full costs of the trip. Students are asked to pay \$100. The \$40 non-refundable deposit is due by Friday, September 15 and the remaining balance of \$60 is due by Friday, October 13. Snacks or monetary donations to purchase snacks for the trip are much appreciated.

Secretary's Report:

• The minutes from the **August 2023** Chapter meeting were read silently by the members. The recap was done by Secretary Amethyst Whitley.
