WEBSTER COUNTY, IA is county in the U.S. state of Iowa. As of the 2010 census, the population was 38,013, but decreased to 35,904 according to the 2020 census. The county seat is Fort Dodge. The county was established in January 1851, one of 43 counties established by a legislative package. This county was named after Daniel Webster, an American statesman noted for his moving oratory.

Webster County comprises the Fort Dodge, IA Micropolitan Statistical Area. With an area of 718 square miles, of which 716 square miles is land and 2.8 square miles or 0.4% is water.



Webster County, formally known as Yell County, was created by act of the General Assembly in 1851. It was named for the second Governor of Arkansas, Colonel Archibald Yell, who was killed at the Battle of Buena Vista in the Mexican War. It embraced all of the present territory of Webster except the north tier of congressional townships. The county had never been organized up to 1853, when by act of the Legislature it was incorporated with the new county of Webster.

This county was formed by uniting the former county of Webster, which had first been named Risley, Risley was created in 1851 and embraced the territory now consisting of Hamilton County,

with Yell County; making thirty-two congressional townships. The name of Webster was given by this act and the county of Yell ceased to exist.

In recent presidential elections, Webster County had a strong Democratic lean, voting for the party's candidate in every election from 1984 to 2012. In 2016 however, the county swung hard to vote for Republican Donald Trump by a wide margin, a nearly 27 point swing compared to 2012.

FORT DODGE

he area where Fort Dodge would be built had long been called home to the Sioux, Winnebago, and Sac and Fox before lowa became a part of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803. Up until the time that Lewis and Clark came through in 1805, the region was only known to the American Indian tribes and French fur traders.

In 1835, one of the first explorations of the area was made by three companies of the 1st U.S. Dragoons led by Lieutenant Colonel Stephen Kearny. The objective was to identify future sites for military posts. The men traveled up the Des Moines River, through southern Minnesota before heading south to the Fort Dodge area. When they came upon Lizard Creek, they noted how the site would be suitable for a potential fort along the Des Moines River.

A few years later a stage line would follow the same path the soldiers had taken, which would become known among the early settlers as the "Dragoons' Trail."

Brevet Major Lewis Armistead, who had scouted the area earlier, chose the very site that was recommended by the Dragoons 15 years earlier. Overlooking the the junction of the Des Moines River and Lizard Creek, the site offered good water, timber



and stone for building. Armistead led in the construction of the post and brought in a steam sawmill to speed up the work. Fort Dodge was named in honor of Colonel

Henry Dodge, the U.S. Senator of Wisconsin Territory (which included lowa at the time) and the founder of the Dragoons.

The next spring, nine more buildings were constructed. The population at the post consisted of three commissioned officers, 10 non-commissioned officers, about 75 enlisted men and 40 civilians, many of whom were family members of the soldiers.

Unfortunately, three years after it was established the post was decommissioned and the soldiers were ordered to Minnesota to establish Fort Ridgley. It would be years before the "town" was officially established.

Today, the reconstructed Fort Museum and Frontier Village is located on the southwest edge of Fort Dodge. It is a full-scale recreation of a military outpost on the prairie from the 19th century and also features a reconstructed village from the same time period.

Buildings and corresponding collections include a family cabin, church, one room school house, cabinet shop, land office, general store, drug store, jail, print shop, blacksmith shop, livery stable, pottery building and tinsmith shop. Other collections included are prehistoric, military, Native American, Civil War, period furniture and early Fort Dodge artifacts.

The only remaining cabin from the fort which established Fort Dodge is dedicated to Lewis A. Armistead, a confederate general killed at Pickett's Charge during

the Battle of Gettysburg. Prior to joining the confederacy, Armistead served as Quartermaster at Fort Dodge. Another special exhibit building tells the story of the Cardiff Giant, one of the most famous hoaxes from the 19th century which was carved from gypsum mined near Fort Dodge.

The annual event of "Frontier Days" is held on the Fort Museum grounds. It features a parade, beauty pageant, historical reenactments, a buckskinner camp, and live entertainment.

Gowrie

The city was named after Gowrie, in Scotland.

Each year, the town hosts the Gowrie 4th of July Celebration, which draws thousands of people from around the state for the parade, fireworks, carnival, and bandshell performances. The parade is the longest running consecutive parade in lowa, beginning in 1873 and continuing each year since.

Several churches stand in testament to a strong faith community, including both Methodist and Lutheran churches. Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, a magnificent open-arched structure, was built by hometown business, Johnson Lumber Company, owned by Axel and Carl Johnson, and was completed in March, 1931.





Dayton

The city was named after Dayton, Ohio.

Since 1937, Dayton has been the site of a rodeo on Labor Day weekend. It began with a pair of local cowboys and has grown to a National Championship Rodeo, sanctioned by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. The rodeo features bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, bull riding, calf roping, team roping, steer wrestling, barrel racing, and the wild horse race.

Coalville

Coalville takes its name from the coal mines of the area. It began as one of the northernmost coal mining towns in lowa. Early settlers were mining coal from outcrops along the Des Moines River by 1860, and in 1870, a mine was opened on Holiday Creek, about a mile east of Coalville, with a 3-mile tramway to the Dubuque and Sioux City Railroad (later the Illinois Central).



Badger



Located eight miles northeast of Fort Dodge, Iowa in Webster County covering about 680 acres. Population is 522.

Badger Township was organized on October 10, 1865, and the town of Badger was laid out and plotted by Charles Knudson in 1882. Knudson is known as the "Founder of Badger".

Badger had been recognized as a town since 1882, but it was not until February 8, 1900, that the town was incorporated.

Otho

Is a city in Webster County, Iowa, with a population of 429.

According to the United States Census Bureau, the city has a total area of 0.46 square miles (1.19 km2), all of it land.

The median age in the city was 42.6 years.





Lehigh

Located in a valley, Lehigh is divided in two by the Des Moines River, unusual for such a small town. Originally the two halves of Lehigh were two separate towns. While the town on the west side of the River was always called Lehigh, the east town was called Slabtown, and a piece of history marks the east side's roots—a sign that hangs over the playground with the words "Slabtown Traders," perhaps alluding to the flea market that occurs there every summer during Lehigh River Days.

Duncombe

Is a city in Webster County, Iowa, in the United States. The population is 381.

Duncombe is named for Hon. J. F. Duncombe.

According to the United States Census Bureau, the city has a total area of 1.97 square miles (5.10 km2), all of it land.

The median age in the city was 40.5 years.



Callender



Between 1866 and 1870 the Des Moines Valley Railroad Company constructed tracks between Des Moines and Fort Dodge. The other end of the line originated at Keokuk, Iowa (at the confluence of the Des Moines and Mississippi rivers). At 7 to 10 mi intervals were 38 stops between Keokuk and Fort Dodge. Kesho, town that would become Callender, was the 36th stop.

In 1875, the town was renamed Callender in honor of Agnes and James Callender of Brooklyn Heights, New York City, New York who owned all of the land on the west side of the railroad tracks and much of the surrounding area—Webster's Prairies.
