

<u>Approval of Agenda:</u> Motion by J. Lippert, 2nd by C. Anderson to approve the agenda as presented. Motion approved.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Averaging 10 people at the Brook Services. Currently working on a baptism in May, 2 funerals in June, 1 wedding renewal in June. Working on study guide for summer Bible Study.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> J. Heinlein went over the report for the month of March. Motion by M. Stuart, 2nd by M. Raymond to approve the reports. Motion approved. Then he went over the reports for the month of April. Motion by J. Lippert, 2nd by C. Anderson to approve the reports. Motion approved.

Per Mr. Heinlein, the housing allowance paid to pastors will not be a taxable benefit. In January we discussed putting money into an investment account to earn more interest. The plans offered through the National Church are not insured. It is a 3-year investment, the rates are competitive, and it is considered a ministry to other churches. It was discussed to have the Thrivent representative come to the next meeting to discuss what they had in investment account. We have a small amount of tax credit increase coming from Consumer's Energy. The Spectrum download speed has been increased. The Waste Management contract is up. Jim Lippert will look to compare prices with other companies in the area. Noisy offering for the first quarter was \$160.00 to go to Veteran's Affair. It was discussed to add to this amount to round it up to an even number. Motion by R. Anderson, 2nd by M. Stewart to approve an increase to \$500.00 to donate to the veterans. Motion approved. The Day Care bought some toys for the playground. Mr. Heinlein questioned if we wanted so to support this purchase. The decision was not at this time. A letter was received from the Roscommon/St Helen Little League asking if we wanted to renew our board at the field. The Men's group will pay for this.

Committee Reports

Mutual Ministry - None.

Stewardship - None.

Outreach – September 8 is "God's Work Our Hands" Sunday. Need to decide if and how we are going to participate.

<u>Property Management</u> – The Range Hood Issue. No one is interested in even bidding on the job to install. The state has said it is not necessary and will not help to cool the kitchen in the summer. The gentleman who gave it to the church would like it back if we are not going to use it. Motion by C. Anderson, 2nd by A. Jordan to return the hood. Motion approved.

Door Locks – trying to get a quote for the doors.

<u>Steeple</u> – R. Falardeau is working on getting the contractors to repair it. He met with a painter. A quote from CLS Painting is 2,000.00 to power wash, sand as needed, repaint. Available to start soon. Requires $\frac{1}{2}$ down deposit.

Motion by J. Lippert, 2nd by C. Anderson to award up to \$2,000 and additional repairs not to exceed \$1,000.00 if needed. Need proof of liability and work comp insurance.

<u>Dinner Committee</u> – Dinners are getting difficult to do. There is not enough help, not as many people being served. We have dinners scheduled through November for this year. We need to look further into whether there is a need for more dinners.

WELCA - No report.

MELCA – Donated \$50.00 to Little League. Purchased chairs for fellowship hall.

Children's Church - Going well.

Correspondence: Received a flyer on pin cushions.

<u>Old Business:</u> Hearing Problems. Pastor will contact Marshall Music in Traverse City to look into more speakers and how to upgrade the system.

New Business:

<u>Election Committee</u> – Ann will review terms and get dates of expiration. We will need 6 new members this election. Need to look at not having too many married couples serving.

Investment for Church Funds – Already Discussed

Change Door Locks – Already Discussed

<u>Congregational Meeting</u> - June 23 after service. Need to have a Financial Audit before the Congregational Meeting. R. Anderson, A. Jordan and L. Wilkerson will meet for an audit before the next council meeting.

<u>Communication of Information</u> – Need to work on getting information circulated to those who need to know. Mutual Ministry will investigate and report back on suggestions.

<u>Food Trucks</u> – The 7-church food truck committee has run into an impossible problem and may have to dissolve. There is enough money in the funds to finish off the year. Decisions will be made through the 7-church committee and we will look into once they decide.



MORNINGS WITH GOD

The Bible frequently uses the morning to evoke the idea of recurrence. The place of the morning in a day is paramount because it can become the starting point for many good habits. I personally pay great attention to what I do at the beginning of my days... Here are a few passages from the Bible regarding the morning:

- "And the priest shall burn wood on it every morning..." (Leviticus <u>6:12</u>)
- "And they burn to the Lord every morning..." (2 Chronicles 13:11)
- "For morning by morning it will pass over..." (Isaiah 28:19)
- "Bring your sacrifices every morning..." (<u>Amos 4:4</u>)
- "Every morning He brings His justice to light..." (Zephaniah 3:5)

Every morning offers the opportunity to practice a good habit.

If I don't find the time in my very full days, I can, for example, wake up an hour or half an hour earlier to:

Take the time to take care of myself.

- Take time with God and read my Bible.
- Plan out my day and avoid the stress of the last minute.
- Write down my expectations for my day/week and start on a positive note.
- Start working on what I usually always put off, to free my day of a task that I dread (answering those emails, starting that algebra homework, cleaning the bathroom...)
- Today, know that the time you give to God, particularly at the beginning of your day, isn't lost time. It will be hugely beneficial for the rest of your day...you'll have taken time to be renewed and receive what you needed: peace, assurance, joy, trust, strength, etc.
- Make each morning the best asset of your day!
