FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Amelia Baptist,

"So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." (Psalm 90:12)

As I am writing this, it is currently 18 degrees outside of the church office. Needless to say, it is bitterly cold. Now I'm not sure about you, but it is during the dead of winter that I begin to seriously long for the warmth of the spring and summer days. There is nothing quite like feeling the warmth of the sunshine without the piercing bite of the cold. Yet, as I think about the reality of winter, I'm thankful that God has woven together a picture of our lives. The seasons not only proclaim the glory of God, but they also reveal a significant truth about the brevity of life. You see, cold winter days such as this remind us that what was once warm and full of life, is now cold and dead. The natural things of this earth have come for a season but are now gone. That might seem like a depressing thought to think about. But just as the seasons depict the brevity of the natural world around us, the Scriptures themselves testify to the transitory nature of our physical lives.

Moses, the great prophet and receiver of God's Law, came to understand just how fleeting our lives really are. And he reflects upon this truth in Psalm 90 where he is recounting how God is eternal and man's physical life is momentary. He speaks of God existing before the foundation of the world was laid. He likens humanity to that of the dust of the earth and the grass of the field. In all, our days and our strength is limited. So how does Moses counsel us with this sobering reality?

He says that we are to consciously number our days by remembering that mortality is a fact for all of humanity. Again, this sounds depressing doesn't it? Who really likes to think about death? Our culture seeks to suppress any thought of death. And even our churches at times focus more on the victorious Christian life instead of living faithfully in light of our future death. But beloved, we must remember that the only reason we have a victorious hope in the next life is because of the death of One who died in our place; the Lord Jesus. So as believers we cannot escape the reality of death.

Now when we (those who follow Jesus) think much on the brevity of our lives and the larger picture of God's eternal kingdom to come, it will work in our favor to sober us up to realize what matters most in this life. This is seen at the end of Psalm 90:12. Moses counsels us to number our days, but he does so knowing that there is an end goal. The goal is that we may get a heart of wisdom. But what is a heart of wisdom? The heart of wisdom is understanding that our lives are not our own and that we are to make our days count for the glory of God, not the glory of self. That is what matters most for believers. You see, this focus rightfully kills pride and humbles us to think about living for the glory of God. So beloved, as we continue in this cold season called winter, please do not ignore death nor fall into a morbid introspection about death. Rather, number your days so that it would stir your affections for Jesus in order that you might live faithfully for Jesus.
