FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Amelia Baptist,

"He (Jesus) was the son of Mary; He was verily and indeed born, and ate and drank; He was verily persecuted in the days of Pontius Pilate, and verily and indeed crucified, and gave up the ghost in the sight of all heaven and earth and the powers of the nether world. He was also verily raised up again from the dead, for His Father raised him; and in Jesus Christ will His Father similarly raise us who believe in Him, since apart from Him there is no true life for us." (Ignatius – Letter to the Trallians)

Outside of the New Testament, have you ever wondered what the early church thought of Jesus? Have you ever wanted to know how they were able to endure such cultural hostility for their beliefs? Well, one of the joys of my sabbatical was being able to spend time reading what these early Christians believed regarding the gospel and how they lived under such harsh realities. And one such figure that stood out was that of Ignatius of Antioch. We don't know much about his life and ministry, aside from the letters he wrote to several churches across Asia Minor (Turkey). But what we do know is enough to encourage our hearts this Easter season.

According to what we know, Ignatius lived from about 35-107AD and was friends with a man by the name of Polycarp. Both he and Polycarp had the privilege of being discipled by the Apostle John, and both became well-known leaders in the early church. In his older years, Ignatius became the bishop of the city of Antioch, after the Apostle Peter was condemned and sent to Rome. It was here that his ministry caught the eye of the Emperor Trajan. Now, scholars are not quite sure how Ignatius' arrest came about, but his letters tell of his final journey on earth. He was arrested by Roman guards and was taken by land across Asia Minor on his way to Rome. During his travels, he was allowed to write letters and even spend time with several churches (Ephesus, Philadelphia, Smyrna, etc.). One of the most striking facts about his letters is the depiction of his mindset. He was a man who knew the gospel and he considered dying for Christ one of the noblest of acts. He said in his letter to the Roman church, "Now I begin to be a disciple...Let fire and cross, flocks of beasts, broken bones, dismemberment...come upon me, so long as I attain to Jesus Christ." He understood that true discipleship was about counting the ultimate cost for Christ. And the cost for him was his life in the Roman Colosseum.

This determination, this focus, was built upon none other than the beauty of who Jesus is and his glorious resurrection. It was the truth of Christ that led him to deny all worldly pleasures, in order to seek to be a faithful witness even unto death. As you can clearly see from his quote above, taken from his letter to the Trallians, Ignatius held fast to the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. He understood that apart from Jesus, there is no such thing as true life. And Ignatius firmly believed that for those who are in Christ, Jesus' resurrection foreshadowed our future resurrection with Christ in heaven. Beloved, do you see how the truth of the gospel shapes the focus of one's life, even amidst cultural chaos and pressure? Because of the truth of who Jesus is and his resurrection, we have an anchor for our faith and the very motivation to continue in it.

So, this month, let us celebrate Easter like we've never celebrated it before. Let us remind ourselves of how sweet it is to gather with believers on this most holy of Sundays. And let us continue to live our lives faithfully for Christ, knowing that it is the truth of the gospel that grounds and guides us in this life; even if this life may end in a similar fashion to that of Ignatius'.
