#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Amelia Baptist Family,

"Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish. Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD his God, who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, who keeps faith forever; who executes justice for the oppressed, who gives food to the hungry." (Psalm 146:3-7)

Next month marks a major event in the life of our country as we are setting out to elect the 46<sup>th</sup> president of the United States. Electing the next Commander in Chief is no trivial task and it is something which weighs heavily upon our hearts as citizens. We all want "our candidate" to be the one who takes the Oval Office because we all desire something better for the nation that we love so dearly. And this desire for something better is good and appropriate for the flourishing of our country. But in our desire for that which is better, we must to be careful with our hearts because the threat of idolatry is not far behind.

Despite the great privilege that we have with voting during an election season, our tendency as fallen human beings is to place our passion, our hope, and our focus around that of political power and party lines instead of pursuing a God-centered and gospel-saturated agenda. We place far more emphasis upon a candidate than that of the sovereign God of the universe. And this beloved, is a tragedy that is committed far too often in the American Church. But I do not believe that this struggle is unique to the American Church. We see early on in the Scriptures where the people of God idolize and value kings and nations over that of God Himself. This way of thinking led Israel to desire a physical human king in order that they might be like the surrounding nations (1 Samuel 8). They rejected God for a man. And this form of idolatry continued throughout the many generations of Israel's history, and ultimately led to the nation's demise. Therefore, this is not unique to a fallen humanity.

So, what is a good and encouraging word for us as we prepare for yet another presidential election? I believe the words of Psalm 146 speak clearly to our hearts as it reminds us how our God is the sovereign ruler and hope of not only this country, but also the entire world. The psalmist calls us to see that salvation is found in God and God alone. Man on the other hand, is weak and no matter how great his policies and plans are, he will eventually fade out and someone else will take his place – in our case if not in 4 years, it will be 8 years. Beloved, a hope that only lasts 4 to 8 years is no hope at all. Yet, the One who has made everything and the One who has sustained our faith will do so forever – that is true and lasting hope.

And notice how the psalmist directs our attention to the justice and fatherly care of God. He states that God will avenge the oppressed and feed those who are hungry. Beloved, policies may be good for a time or they may bring disaster. But remember, God is the true sustainer of those who are weak and weary in this world. He has come to lift our burdens, demonstrate justice that reflects true righteousness, and bring us joy in Christ. When we place that type of hope in man, we are setting ourselves up for failure. This type of hope is only for One who is able to bear our greatest of burdens – and that is our Lord. So, on the eve of this next election, let me encourage you exercise your right to vote. Carry out the privilege you've been given as a citizen of this great country. But do so with an open hand and prayerful mind; knowing who really owns and rules all things. Trust the One whose kingdom cannot be shaken, whose plan never fails, and who knows all things.
