FIELD EVENTS

NOTE.—In the High Jump the standards with platform rests will be used. Instead of the old pegs supporting the cross bar, supports are provided at the top of the standards which are 11-2 inches wide and 23-8 inches deep. It will be seen that with this standard a very slight touch will be sufficient to dislodge the cross bar. In the Pole Vault the old type of standard with 3 inch pegs will be used. There will be no longer any balks or balk lines in any field event.

Running Broad Jump

Each competitor allowed 6 trials in series of 2 trials each, but two competitors alternate in taking one jump each for their two trials. The length of the runway is unlimited. The take-off is a black band painted on the runway. The edge toward the pit is the scratch line. Measurements are made at right angles from this line to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the jumper's body. In making a jump no part of the jumper's shoe or foot shall touch the "ground" in front of the project over the scratch line. Crossing the line is a jump.

judge shall determine the height at which the bar shall be placed. Each competitor has three trials at each height in his turn, but he may waive a trial at any height. A competitor may not dive nor somersault. In crossing the bar if the feet do precede the head the head must not be below the buttocks, as and when the head crosses the bar. Making a spring to jump or passing under the bar or beyond the bar of the bar produced is a trial. No weights or grips may be used.
