• **SETON HALL TRIUMPHS** — Flirtisha Harris set two meet records to lead Seton Hall to the front of the pack midway through the final day of competition yesterday to capture the ECAC Women's Division I Track and Field Championships in Fairfax, Va..

"I felt pretty good today, even though I hadn't yet qualified for nationals," said Harris, a junior from Calvert Hall, Md. who was named the meet's outstanding athlete. "I was a little worried because this was my last chance, but I've always run really well on this track."

Harris set the meet records winning the 100 (11.47 seconds) and 200 (23.15), and sophomore Julia Sandiford led the way as the Pirates took home first, third and fourth in the 400.

Seton Hall ended with 106 points and held off a late challenge by Georgetown to capture its first ECAC crown. The Pirates finished second a year ago. Georgetown finished nine points behind for second place.

"We were in pretty good shape when we started out today, because I felt we had the stronger legs," Seton Hall coach John Moon said. "But I thought we had lost it when we fell in the four-by-one."

Pittsburgh, completed a sweep by Big East Conference teams by coming in a distant third at 64 points. Two-time defending champion George Mason was next with 61 points.

Virginia, which led heading into yesterday's competition, came in fifth with 56 points, while Connecticut was sixth at 37. Boston University (35 points), Syracuse (27 ½), Providence and West Virginia (26 points each) rounded out the top ten.

The Pirates won the 100, 200 and 400 meter dashes, finished second in the 400 hurdles, and swept third through fifth positions in the 100 hurdles.

Yet, Seton Hall suffered a damaging blow when it failed to finish in the 400 relay, and saw its lead dwindle when Georgetown placed first, third and fourth in the 3,000.

Despite finishing behind the Hoyas in both the 1,600 and 3,200 relays, the Pirates hung on for the victory.

Other double winners included Georgetown's Christi Constantin in the 5,000 and 10,000, and George Mason's Susan Moats, who won both the hammer throw and shot put.

The meet was delayed with two events remaining when high winds and heavy rains roared through the area. Officials resumed competition after a 45-minute delay, and the 1,600 and 3,200 relays were run in a driving rain.

Provisionally speaking, Alicia Giuliano is headed for the NCAA Championships on June 2-5 in New Orleans. The Rutgers University sophomore from Toms River ran off with the 10,000-meter title in the ECAC Women's Championships yesterday at George Mason University, Fairfax, Va., and her time of 35:07.99 met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard.

Another Rutgers' star was Jen Heggie of Tinton Falls, whose sixth-place 2:09.67 800 meters was an all-time Rutgers record.

It was the Seton Hall team, though, that stole the overall spotlight. Coach John Moon's squad produced four individual gold medalists and wound up running to its first ECAC team crown with a 106-point total, relegating Georgetown (97) to second and Pitt (64) to third as 40 schools reached the scoring column.

Seton Hall's champions were Flirtisha Harris in the dashes (11.47 and 23.15), Julia Sandiford in the 400 (53.79) and Shana Williams in the long jump (21-6). Williams added a second in the high jump and Natasha Reynolds a second in the 400 hurdles and thirds in the 100 dash and 100 hurdles.
