

COLLEGE RECORD BROKEN

Woodruff of the University of Pennsylvania Establishes a New Distance for Hammer Throwing.

EVENTS ON BERKELEY OVAL

The Preliminaries in the Field and Track Sports of the Intercollegiate Association—Those Who Will Enter the Contests To-day.

The preliminary events of the twenty-second annual field and track sports of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America were held on Berkeley Oval yesterday afternoon. The semi-finals and finals will be decided this afternoon.

The day was ideal for good athletic performances, but, although all the contests were close, only one record was broken. In the hammer-throwing event W. G. Woodruff of the University of Pennsylvania threw 136 feet 3 inches, thus breaking the previous record of 135 feet 7½ inches, held by W. O. Hickok of Yale.

Wefers of Georgetown had everything his own way in the 100-yard dash, as did Hollister of Harvard in the half-mile run and Burke of Boston University in the 440-yard event. These men are looked on as sure winners in their events to-day, although they will be pushed hard by men who made excellent showings yesterday.

TWO NEW COLLEGE RECORDS.

**University of Pennsylvania Athletes
Carry Off the Honors in the
Berkeley Oval Games.**

The final events in the intercollegiate athletic games were decided at Berkeley Oval yesterday afternoon before a large and enthusiastic crowd of spectators. The University of Pennsylvania won over the rest of the colleges represented, with thirty-four points to her credit. Yale secured second place with a record of twenty-four and one-twelfth points.

The best Harvard could do was to win fifteen and three-quarter points, while Princeton was only eight-twelfths of a point behind the crimson. The other colleges securing points were Georgetown, Cornell, Boston University, Syracuse, Wesleyan, and Trinity.

On the whole the result is about what was expected by those who have followed the athletes in their season of training. Although Harvard had defeated the University of Pennsylvania in their dual games at Cambridge, it was only by a technicality that Harvard will go down in history as the victor. Pennsylvania was generally conceded to be stronger than Harvard, and the Cambridge team had been snowed under by Yale at New Haven. The only surprise of the day was the 220-yard run, in which the invincible Wefers of Georgetown met his Waterloo, and was beaten by two feet by Coifelt, the Princeton freshman.

As was expected, Hollister of Harvard galloped away from the field in the half-mile run, and T. E. Burke won with ease in the 440-yard dash. Unfortunately a strong breeze blew directly down the finish, and so on the track no records were broken. In the field events, however, it was otherwise. Woodruff of the University of Pennsylvania equaled his throw of 136 feet 3 inches in the hammer made on Friday, thus establishing a new record. It had been previously held by W. O. Hickok of Yale, at 135 feet 7½ inches.

In the pole vault, Johnson of Yale cleared the bar at 11 feet 3¾ inches, thus breaking the old record, of 11 feet 2¾ inches, held by W. W. Hoyt of Harvard and C. T. Buchholz of the University of Pennsylvania. J. D. Winsor, Jr., of the University of Pennsylvania, won the high jump handily at 6 feet 1 inch. He afterward made an attempt to break the world's record of 6 feet 5¾ inches, held by Sweeney. He succeeded in clearing 6 feet 3 inches, which will go as the new record.
