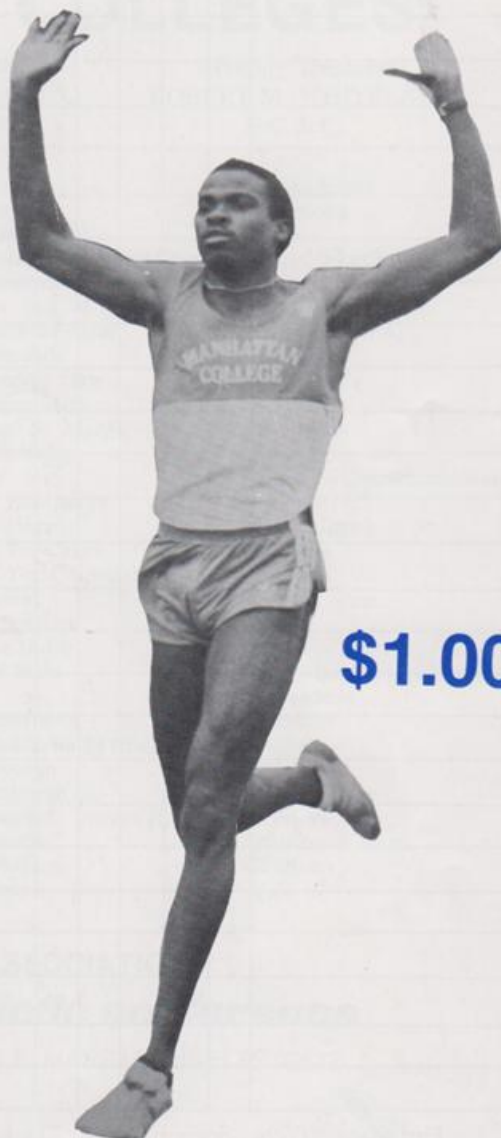

Steve Bartold: Making Believers at Yale

Already established as one of the East's top coaches, Steve Bartold has proven himself as a man who can build a program by making his athletes believe—in both themselves and their team. His record at St. John's and now at Yale is a long and respected one. At St. John's he developed 22 male and female All-Americans, 11 NCAA champions and a host of All-East, Big East and Metropolitan Conference champions. At Yale, he has molded four All-Ivy selections, an All-East pick and two Heptagonal champions. From his start as a coach at St. John's in 1961 to the present, Bartold is obviously a winner.

Bartold was a basketball and football player as well as a trackman at Sewanhaka High School on Long Island, but his track coach, Jim Fraley, wanted him to give up all his other activities to run full-time. "I actually went out for track because I got cut from the baseball team," said Steve.

At St. John's, Bartold set school records for the quarter and half-mile and was the Met Conference champion at a quarter-mile. He scored in the IC4A meet and was awarded the prestigious McSweeney Award, which goes to the athlete who "Best Typifies the St. John's Man." Bartold's junior year, SJU coach Bill Ward recommended him for the head track and field coaching job at St. Agnes High School in Rockville Centre, Long Island. "I gave myself five years to do something with coaching," explained Bartold. "Four years later I was appointed head coach at St. John's."

It was, to say the least, a highly successful partnership. Bartold developed his first national caliber athlete in 1964 when Tommy Farrell, the man who held the world record in the indoor half-mile, represented the United States in the Tokyo Olympics. Where was Bartold while his star pupil was realizing a dream? "I was here, watching the TV at the Farrell's for the results."

It was also in 1964 that Bartold's harriers ended one of the longest holds on a title anywhere—Manhattan's 17-year reign as Metropolitan Conference Indoor champions. Bartold would direct SJU to three more Met indoor, two outdoor and three cross-country championships. John Kaiser, St. John's head baseball coach from 1956-1973 and now its athletic director, believes that "Steve was the guy who brought our program into prominence. He made us contenders every year in the eastern track picture."

After 18 years with the Redmen, Bartold had done almost everything he could possibly do. "I was very satisfied athletically with what we did," he said. Indeed, St. John's won the first Big East outdoor championship.

Steve decided to move north to Yale where he soon brought the Elis to respectability. "We had young kids, Yale hadn't had a .500 season since 1969." That soon changed. The Elis went 5-1 during the 1981-82 outdoor season. Add to that back-to-back 10-1 cross-country marks in 1980 and 1981 and it was obvious that Yale's track fortunes were once again on the rise.

After coaching at one of the East's major scholarship schools, why did Bartold choose Yale, where athletic scholarships are unheard of? "The opportunity was there," he explained. "It was a place I had always thought would be wonderful to coach at. I envied 'Gieg' (legendary Yale coach Bob Giegengack). I also liked the facilities." The facilities Bartold speaks of centers mainly around

Coxe Cage, which Bartold and Yale women's coach Mark Young have helped make into the mecca of Eastern indoor track. One of the nation's fastest synthetic surfaces, Coxe Cage plays host to a number of meets, most notably the Metropolitan and Collegiate Track Conference (CTC) championship, as well as the Yale Invitational which is quickly becoming one of the most popular meets in the east.

"I liked it when it was dirt," joked Bartold. "It was the first time in 21 years I could take my coat off at practice during the indoor season." It must be remembered that St. John's did not possess any indoor facility of its own, so many were the days in the dark, freezing weather that the form of Steve Bartold and his assistants could be seen at the Redmen's outdoor track working with a band of hardy runners.

Bartold stuck with track for "the thrill of the sport," but as he grew as a coach and realized his goals, he found new meaning in coaching. "I try not to set goals for myself, I'd rather set them for the athletes," explained Bartold. "In track, you meet a wide variety of athletes and watch them develop, both as athletes and as people."

Bartold, officially Yale's men's track and cross-country coach, but he and women's mentor Young split their responsibilities, each taking some of the others athletes. Bartold specializes in the half-mile and up and gets results with both male and female runners. At St. John's, he developed 1980 Olympic Kim Thomas, who held the collegiate indoor record at a quarter-mile.

Bartold broadened his horizons by working with various U.S. national teams. He was coach of the AAU team in Finland in 1966 and served as an assistant with the U.S. National Team in a meet with the U.S.S.R. and other national squads in 1970. His international experience culminated in a position as head coach of the 1974 U.S. Junior National Team when it met the Soviets. Bartold will be one of the coaches with the Junior Pan-Am Team in the Bahamas this year.

Bartold has held many offices, both in and out of the track world. His resume lists no fewer than 28 different positions he has held in track and field organizations and 15 not affiliated with track. He is a fellow and freshman advisor at Yale's Berkeley College and has published articles and conducted clinics and camps. In short, Bartold has done just about everything you can do in track. In 1980 he was named NCAA Division I District Two Outdoor Track Coach of the Year.

After being affiliated with so many groups, which does he regard the highest? "The IC4A is the most important outside organization I've belonged to," he said. "I've had more pleasure in helping the people of the IC4A than any other thing I've done. As Secretary-Treasurer of the IC4A Coaches Association since 1968, a member of the Games Committee and Seeding Advisors Committee, I am sincerely interested in devoting as much time as necessary to develop and help the IC4A continue to be the leading collegiate track championship, next to the NCAA's."

In a world of movement, there are those who stand and those who step up and out. Since 1979, the Boston University track program has focused its movement beyond the realm of Boston's Commonwealth Avenue and looked to national competition.

When David Hemery took over the Boston University track program in 1977, it was just another New England team with a New England reputation. However, in 1979, Hemery's work started paying off as the Terriers began acquiring Greater Boston and New England Championships one after the other. Until Northeastern dethroned the Terriers of the New England Outdoor Championships last spring, Boston University had strung together eight straight New England titles. The Terrier cross country team has won five consecutive Greater Boston Championships.

"We like putting Boston University on the map outside of Boston," Terrier distance coach Bruce Lehané said.

Indeed, it is this attitude that has led the Terriers from a presence in New England to a team that scores in eastern and national competition.

"Dave built the program along with the other coaches here," said first year Terrier head coach Kevin Coyne, who started as the Terriers' weight and throws coach in 1979. "Basically, Dave's the guy that did the information building. We're at the point now where we want to continue improving the program. We're doing everything we can to not have a 'rebuilding year,' but still keep building for the future."

Perhaps it's the presence of top individual performers that characterizes this molding of the present team into one with future holdings. The Terriers have four All-Americans on the indoor roster: distance runner Daryl Simoneau, high jumper Nick Saunders, and weightmen Declan Hegarty and Art McDermott.

"You take the talent as high as it'll go and operate on that assumption. It can be tough, but I think it's what distinguishes Boston University in New England. You look at the performances of a Nick or Declan and there's nobody else around to do that," Lehané said.

Lehané operates Boston University's distance team by viewing the season as a schedule with "four tiers."

"First there are the GBCs (Greater Boston Championships) and New Englands which are a high priority. For some of the kids, these meets are realistic points for them to prepare for. The guys

with the greater ability do it at the IC4A's and Nationals. They can take the meets in stride and progress through them and try for peak performances," Lehané said.

Simoneau travelled this road in 1982 when he capped his season with a 30th place overall finish at the 1982 NCAA Cross Country Championships to earn All-America honors.

"It's the pressure of taking the best against the best. The only measure is how the athlete does against what the best has to offer. And when you're trying to go right for the top, you get right next to the breakline. When you go for all the markbles, it can get very frustrating," Lehané said.

For Nick Saunders, the measure of progress has been in inches. Since arriving at Boston University from Paget, Bermuda three years ago, Saunders has improved his mark on the high bar by 5¾ inches. That 5¾ inches has made him one of the nation's premier high jumpers and a candidate for Bermuda's 1984 Olympic team as well.

"I've progressed considerably since my freshman year," Saunders said. "I was a 7-¾ high jumper when I arrived here, and now I'm at 7-6½."

Saunders established the IC4A Indoor high jump mark last year when he cleared 7-6½. Following that performance, he earned All-America accolades at both the 1983 NCAA indoor and outdoor meets. He finished third indoors with a leap of 7-4¾, and was runnerup at the outdoor championship, where he jumped 7-4¼.

This season, Saunders has been polishing his run-up and take-off in hopes of reaching his goal of 7-8.

"I'm up for every meet, that way I get the best out of myself," Saunders said. "I do my best everyday and give 100 percent. Then I go home satisfied."

Satisfaction. For most athletes, it's just a roadside attraction along the highway to the top. An attraction that is looked beyond as long as there are other challenges to face. Striving for satisfaction means one thing for an athlete—more work.

"It used to be that we'd go to the New Englands and that would be it, except for a couple of guys who'd straggle down to Princeton," Terrier weightman Declan Hegarty said. "Now we're getting a better grip."

Hegarty's grip, along with fellow weightman Art McDermott's is one that has strengthened due to dedication and the expertise provided by Coyne, who is considered one of the top coaching technicians in the nation.

"He's the guru," Art McDermott said. "He was given that name at Tufts (where Coyne coached prior to Boston U). He's the Guru of the Eastern Weights."

"In the hammer, he's the only one who knows what's going on currently. The Russians are way advanced in the biomechanics of the throw. He keeps up with the event as it is today. He's from the technical school. Our size (both McDermott and Hegarty are considered small for their events) reflects the technique," Hegarty said. "He builds on what we already have."

Coyne, who was a coach of the East team at the 1983 National Sports Festival, has been a master of studying the weight events and relaying his knowledge to athletes. Hegarty, a top candidate for Ireland's 1984 Olympic team in the hammer throw, has won three straight IC4A hammer titles. He had a record-setting heave of 228-7 to win the 1983 outdoor meet, and followed that with a second place finish at the 1983 NCAA Outdoor Championships where he tossed the hammer 232-2. In addition Hegarty is a two-time All-American on the indoor circuit in the 35-pound weight, placing fourth at the NCAAs last year and third in 1980.

McDermott, who owns a collection of GBC and New England indoor and outdoor titles, placed sixth at the 1983 NCAA Indoor meet with a throw of 62-11½. He won the IC4A Indoor shot put title in 1982 and was ninth at the outdoor nationals last spring.

"When I first came here, people placed limits on me because of my size. They thought I'd be lucky if

I threw 60 feet," McDermott said. "Kevin and I saw more there. This year, I feel I can throw 65-66 feet."

"Working with this level of athletes is great. That's the long shot of it. They're an inspiration to be with. Our role as coaches is to help keep them going," Coyne said. "There is a lot of talent here, and the team does well in every meet it's in. There is a tremendous amount of quality athletes. We're trying to get the team to be one of presence at both the Eastern and national levels."

During the past few years, the Terriers have placed consistently in the top ten at the IC4As, including a fourth at last year's indoor meet and a sixth-place showing outdoors, which they followed up with an 18th-place finish at the NCAAs. On the surface, one can read the points and finishes and conclude—yes, the Terriers are on the move. However, the measure of a team's performance reflects on its individuals, their attitudes, and the coaches' own philosophy on what's right for the individual athlete.

Kevin Coyne summed it up best when he said, "It's great for a coach to have the opportunity to work with kids who have a strong sense of motivation and athletic ability. And who can put it all together when they have to."
